Pets and Fireworks Safety

3 COMMANDMENTS FOR PET SAFETY

1) **Bring you pets - even outdoor pets - inside.** Fireworks can cause your pets to have unexpected, frantic behaviors. Even if your pet normally stays home without any problems, digging under or climbing over fences is very common during thunderstorms and fireworks. They often become disoriented by the lights and sounds and will dart into traffic or become unable to find their way back home.

2) **EVERY pet needs to be wearing current ID.** If your pet does escape from the house, that current ID will be the fastest phone call home! A license or engraved tag is best, but even writing your phone number on a collar with indelible marker is better than nothing. If you are adamantly opposed to putting collars on your cats, please consider buying a microchip ID before July 4th. They are available at a reduced cost from the City of Eugene Spay/Neuter Clinic Monday-Saturday, from 1-4 pm.

3) If you do need to be traveling or otherwise taking your pet outdoors during a fireworks display, **ALWAYS keep them on a leash or in a carrier.** Even the most perfectly well-behaved pet will act unpredictable when frightened by the fireworks.

REMEMBER: If your pet does become lost, or you have found a lost pet, please check at LCAS IMMEDIATELY!
