A NOTE ABOUT CORRECTIONS DATA

Items to consider when reviewing corrections data:

- Small changes in raw numbers between years may create large percentages. For example, a change from 7 to 3 creates a change of 57%. Review of both the raw numbers and percentages to determine the significance of these changes. Youth Services' reports include both measures, when available.
- Data in this report represents crimes that have a corresponding referral to the Lane County Department of Youth Services (Youth Services) which is the juvenile justice provider for the county. If a juvenile crime occurred that was not reported, or law enforcement did not create a referral regarding the crime, it is not included in these data. For example, it has been suggested that the number of "tobacco" referrals for juveniles is much lower than "what people know is occurring in their community." Data in this report represent only juveniles who have been referred for that offense.
- Reported juvenile crime data have benefits and limitations.

Benefits include:

- Determines juvenile crime trend over years
- Describes the proportion of different types of crimes, e.g., person versus property offenses or criminal versus non-criminal, etc.
- Compares county to statewide data

Limitations include:

- As stated above, data are based on reported crime. Interpreting these data out of the context of "victimization data" can be very misleading. For example, a reduction in *reported* crime is interpreted to mean "less juvenile crime" committed in the community and increases in these data are interpreted as a bad thing because they represent "more juvenile crime." These interpretations may be correct, however, there is no way to definitively confirm these assumptions without a victimization rate for the community. Without that rate, we do not know the extent to which reported crime reflects absolute crimes committed in the community.
- Referral data are a weak representation of the impact of the corrections system for several reasons including a) they are influenced by local reporting practices, b) they are influenced by the number of law enforcement officials, and c) the majority of juvenile offenders each year are first time offenders. Recidivism measurements (re-offending behavior) are less vulnerable to these external influences and serve as a stronger measurement of system and program impact. Youth Services has produced a comprehensive review of these data which can be found on its web page.

FINDINGS IN BRIEF

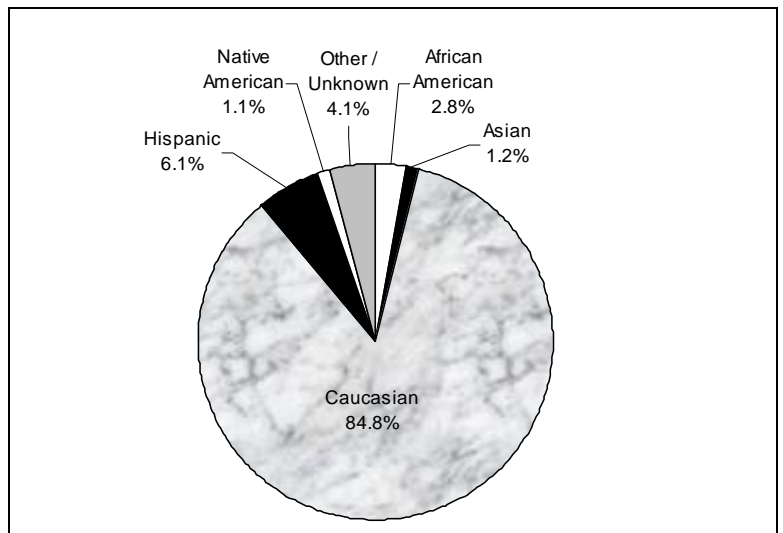
To follow are highlights of data in this report. More detailed information is provided in the sections to follow.

- There has been a steady decrease in reported juvenile crime over the last several years
- Lane County's rate for juvenile delinquency is very similar to the statewide rate
- The majority of juvenile offenders are Caucasian males who have an average age of 14 years old. The majority of their crimes are property crimes.

In 2005 there were 1,798 individual juvenile offenders in Lane County. Those individuals were referred by law enforcement to the juvenile department 2,591 times for 4,121 crimes. On average, each youth committed 2.3 crimes.

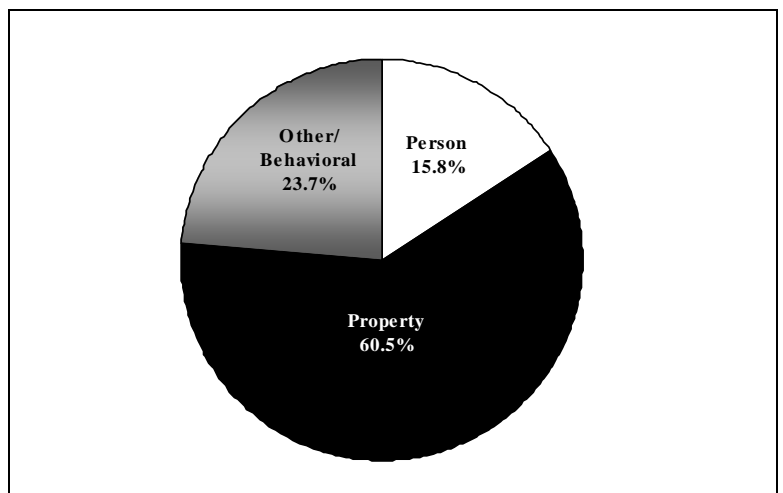

2005 Referral Data Compared to Previous Five-Year Average:

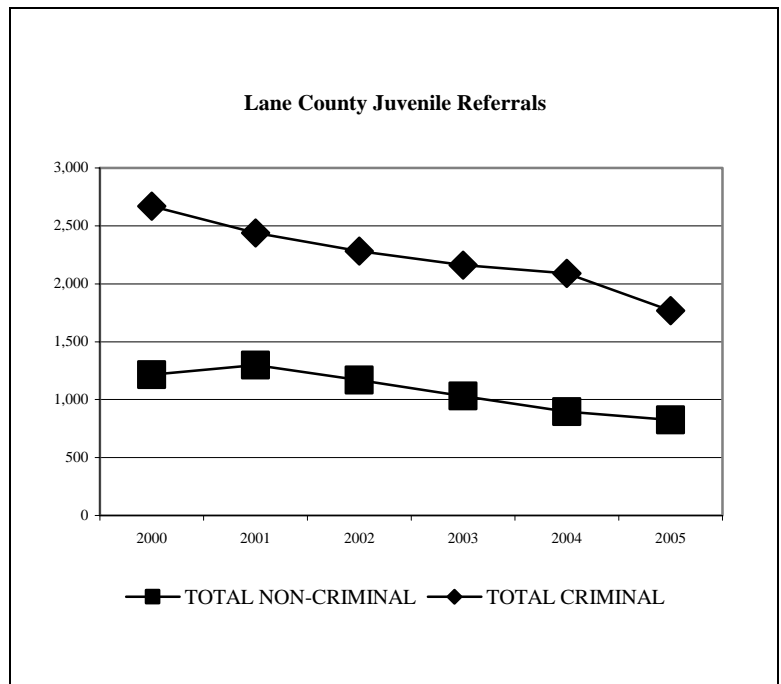
2005 data decreased from the previous five-year average for all crimes except for three – person other, sex offense, and criminal substance/alcohol.

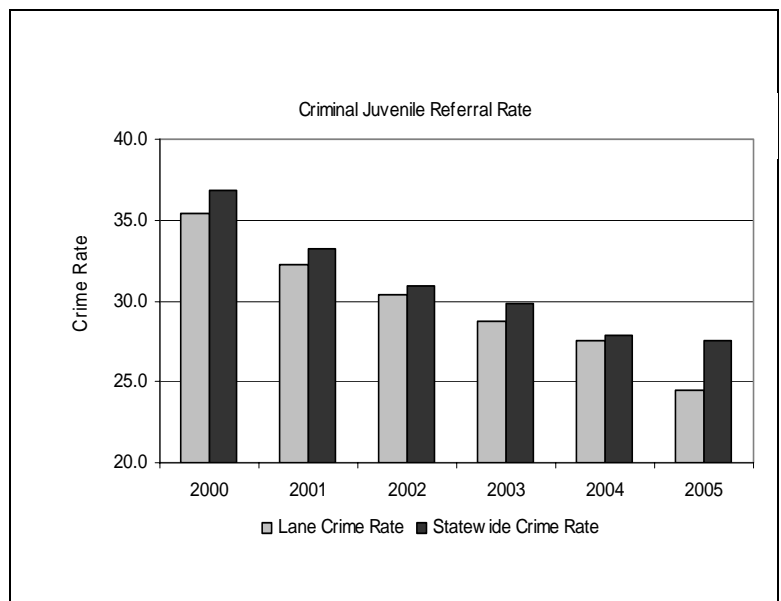
Trend Data: 2000 - 2005

- There has been a steady decrease in reported juvenile crime in Lane County between 2000 and 2005.
- Reported referrals decreased 33.3% (3,885 to 2,591).
 - 35.9% reduction in juvenile person referrals (435 to 279)
 - 36.3% reduction in juvenile property referrals (1,677 to 1,069)
 - 24.8% reduction in juvenile "other/behavioral" referrals (557 to 419).
 - 32.2% reduction in non-criminal referrals (1,216 to 824).



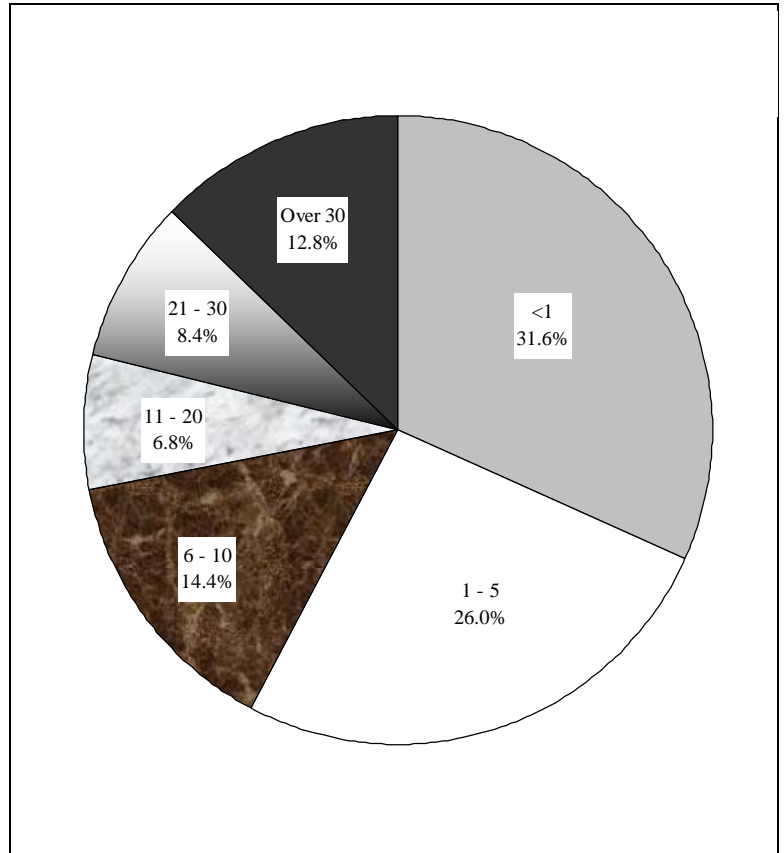
Lane County / Statewide Comparison Referral Rate for 2000 - 2005

- Both Lane County and statewide data show a decrease for the criminal referral rate (rates adjust for changes in population).
- The rate for person referrals in Lane County decreased from 5.8 in '00 to 3.9 in '05 (32.8%). The statewide rate decreased from 6.5 to 5.1 (21.5%).
- The rate for property referrals decreased from 22.3 to 14.8 in Lane County (33.6%) and from 21.5 to 14.8 (31.2%) for statewide data.

REPORT DESCRIPTION

Background - The Lane County Department of Youth Services (Youth Services) is the juvenile justice provider for Lane County, Oregon. Historically, Youth Services has published an annual report that included:

- A departmental overview
- An overview of the philosophy of corrections and treatment interventions for juvenile offenders
- A description of juvenile justice
- Trend data on juvenile crime
- Budget totals (county tax dollars and grant funds)
- A summary data on recidivism (re-offense) trends.
- A literature summary of best practices

While it is important to report on each of these areas, the information on each topic has increased to the point that it is no longer feasible to put it all in one document. Instead, Youth Services will produce separate reports per topic in addition to other research information. These separate documents allow for more detailed information on each topic and more clearly respond to users' specific areas of interest

Report Purpose - This report includes data related to the reported juvenile crime in Lane County. It includes both single year data and trend information. These data are provided by totals, gender, age, race and ethnicity. All data are maintained on the statewide Juvenile Justice Information System (JJIS).

Definitions - This report is divided by counts of individual youth, their referrals and allegations, definitions include:

YOUTH

Definition – “Youth” are individual juvenile offenders referred to Youth Services. Each youth is only counted once per year.

Summary of Youth Data – A brief overview of demographic information, youth criminal activities, trend information and statewide comparisons is provided in this section. Detailed tables and charts on these data follow this overview.

There were 1,798 individual juvenile offenders referred to Youth Services in 2005. The majority of the youth referred were Caucasian 84.8% (1,524) and male 64.8% (1,165).

The greater part of youth referred (1,279) were for criminal offenses.

- Person Crimes = 19.5% (249)
- Property Crimes = 56.3% (720)
- Other/Behavioral Crimes = 24.2% (310)

- Criminal Offenses = 71.1% (1,279)
- Non-Criminal Offenses = 28.9% (519)

There has been a steady decrease of youth with criminal offenses since 2000. Data include:

- Youth with criminal offenses decreased 26.7% (1,744 to 1,279)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with person crimes decreased 28.0% (346 to 249)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with property crimes decreased 30.4% (1,034 to 720)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with other/behavioral crimes decreased 14.8% (364 to 310)

- Youth with non-criminal offenses decreased 20.4% (652 to 519)

Both Lane County and the state experienced a decrease in the rate at which youth were referred to juvenile departments. A comparison between Lane County rates and statewide rates for 2000-2005 includes:

- Rates are based on youth referred to juvenile departments per 1,000 youth in the general population (0-17 age group). Analyzing per capita (rate) data removes the effect of a changing population and simplifies trend comparisons and comparison between groups.

- Youth referred for criminal offenses, Lane County's rate decrease was very similar to that experienced statewide. Lane experienced a decrease of 23.7% (23.2 in '00 and 17.7 in '05) and the state decreased 19% (24.7 to 20).

- Lane County's 2005 rate for person crimes (3.4 per 1,000 youth) is very similar to, and slightly less than, the statewide rate (4.3).

- Lane County's juvenile referral rate for property crimes has historically been higher than the statewide rate; however, the difference is minimal. In '05, the county's rate was 10 and the statewide rate was 10.2. Both have experienced a downward trend since '00. Lane went from 13.7 in '00 to 10 in '05 (27%) and the statewide rate went from 13.7 to 10.2 (25.5).

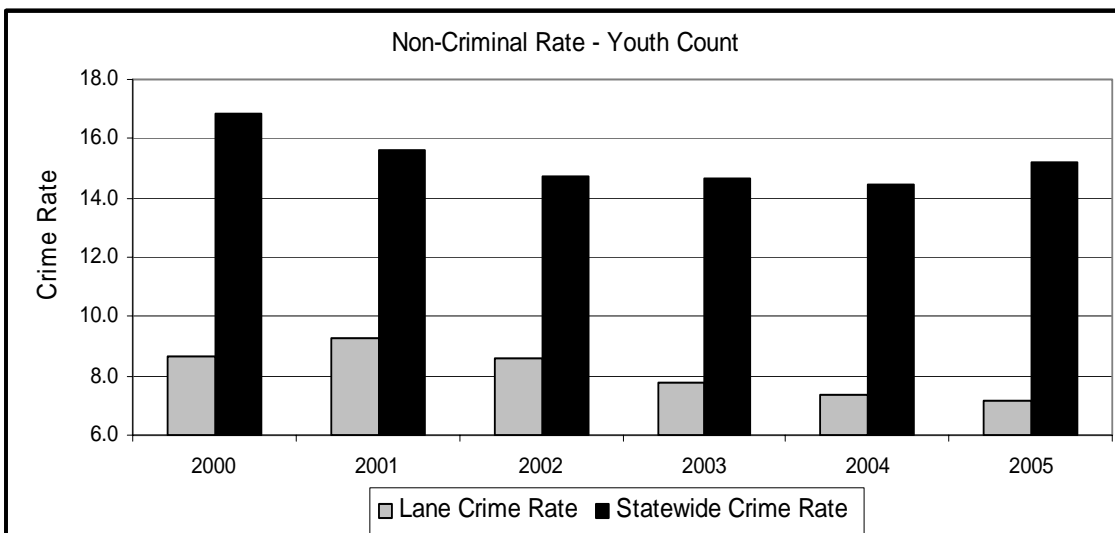
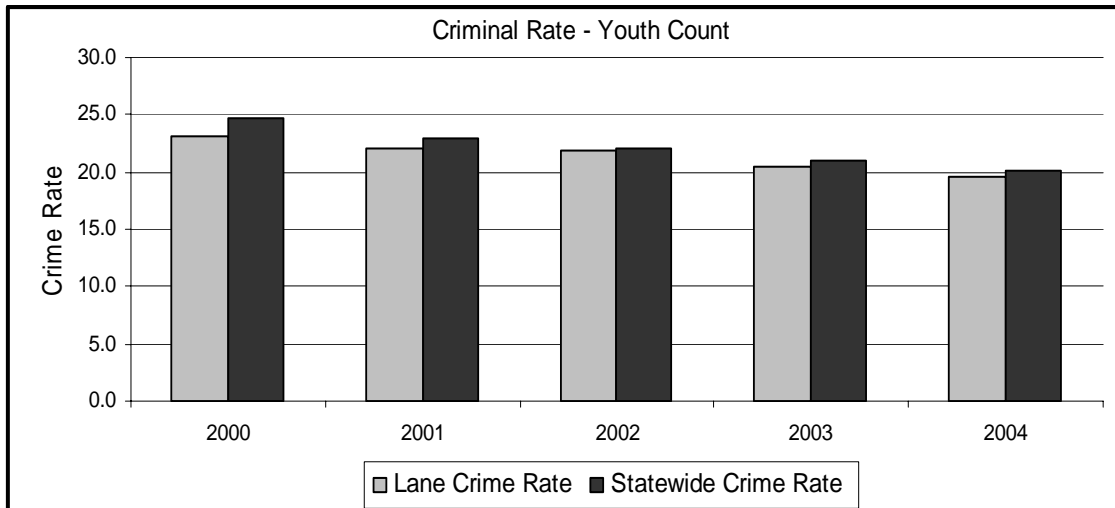

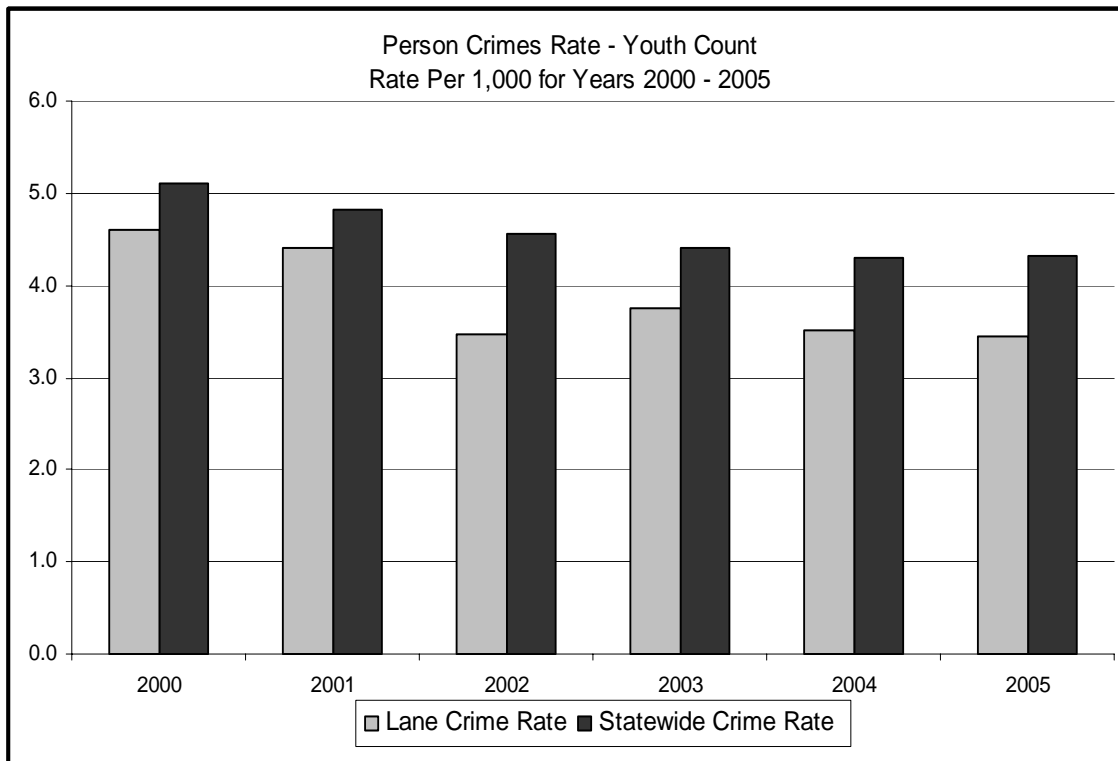
Juvenile Crime Rate - Youth Count For 2000 - 2005
Rate Per 1,000 Youth - By Crime Type

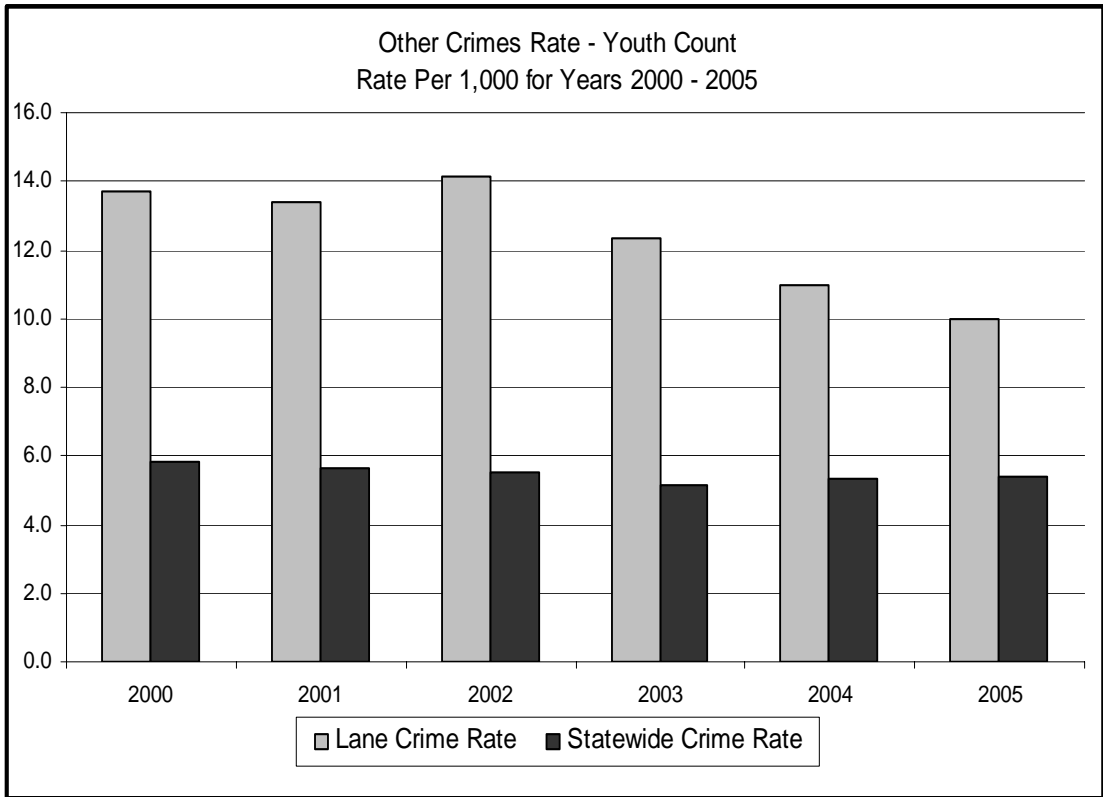
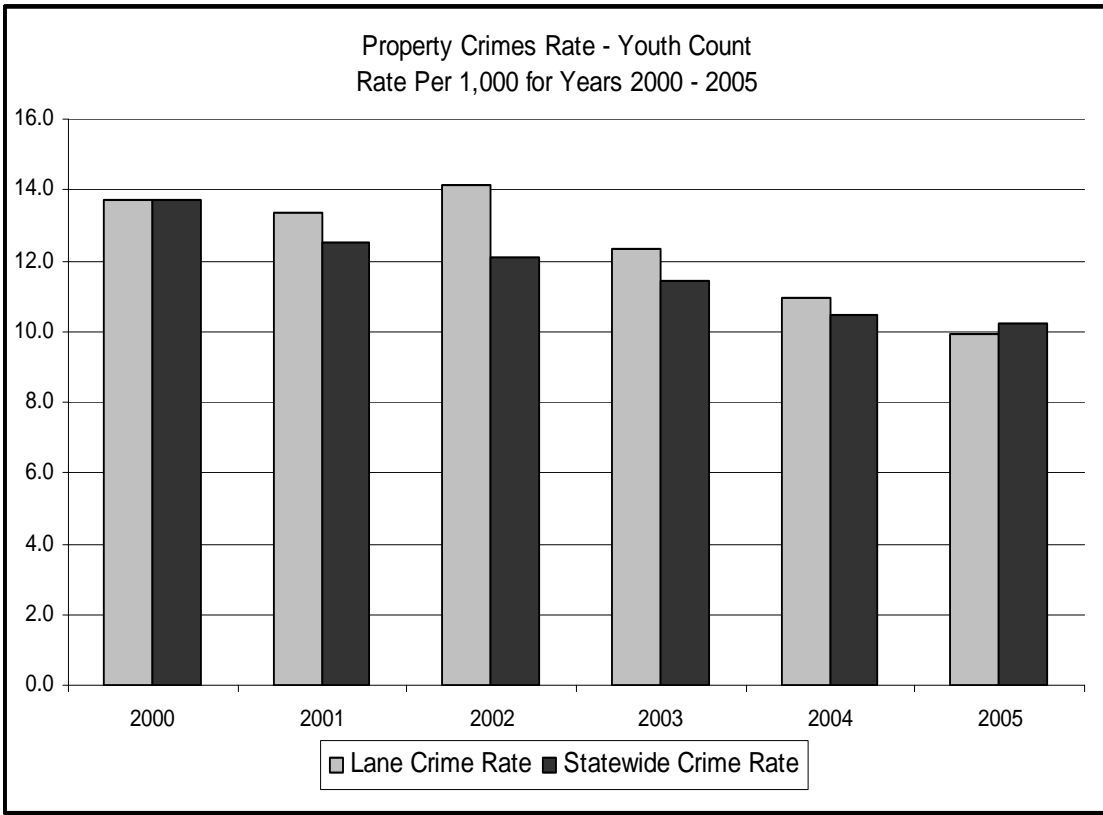

REFERRALS

Definition - A referral is a report from law enforcement officials that contains incidents of criminal or status offenses committed by juveniles. The previous section contained data related to individual youth. Each youth can have more than one referral to the juvenile department during the year.

Summary of Referral Data – A brief overview of types of referrals, trend information and county/state comparisons are provided in this section. Detailed tables and charts on these data follow this overview.

In '05, 1,798 individual juvenile offenders had 2,591 referrals to Youth Services. The majority of those referrals were criminal 1,767 (68.2%) versus non-criminal 824 (31.8%). Of the criminal referrals most were property crimes 1,069 (60.5%). Of the total 2,591 referrals:

- 68.2% (1,767) were criminal referrals
- 31.8% (824) were non-criminal referrals

Just as the number of youth referred to Youth Services since 2000 decreased, so did their referrals for criminal and non-criminal behavior.

- Youth with criminal offenses decreased 33.8% (2,669 to 1,767)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with person crimes decreased 35.9% (435 to 279)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with property crimes decreased 36.3% (1,677 to 1,069)
 - The number of juvenile offenders with other/behavioral crimes decreased 24.8% (557 to 419)
- Youth with non-criminal offenses decreased 32.2% (1,216 to 824)

Data for 2005 referrals as compared to the previous five-year average include:

- 2005 data decreased from the previous five-year average for all crimes except “person other”, sex offense, and substance/alcohol.

“Person Other” crime includes endangering the welfare of a minor, kidnapping, coercion, stalking, etc. These crimes in '05 were one more than the previous average (11 total). Sex offenses experienced an 8.2% increase in '05 from the previous five-year average (61 to 66). Substance use and alcohol experienced a 12.7% increase in '05 from the previous five-year average (165 to 186).

Trend: County/State Comparison Includes (2000 - 2005):

- The referrals rate for criminal referrals decreased between '00 and '05 for both the state and for Lane County.
- The rate for person referrals in Lane County went from 5.8 to 3.9 (32.8% reduction). The statewide rate went from 6.5 to 5.1 (21.5% reduction).
- The rate for property referrals in Lane County went from 22.3 to 14.8 (33.6% reduction). The statewide rate went from 21.5 to 14.8 (31.2% reduction).

Referral data (2,591 referrals) for residence areas includes:¹

- 42.0% (1,088) in Eugene
- 29.7% (769) in Springfield
- 7.3% (189) in Cottage Grove
- 3.9% (102) in Junction City

ALLEGATIONS

Definition – Allegations include the type and number of crimes committed by juvenile offenders as reported on the referral. A single referral can have several allegations. The term is similar to juvenile “offenses” and juvenile “crimes.”

Data on allegations are not as extensive as those on youth and referrals in this report. It does include data for 2005 based on demographic information and type of crime along with a trend summary of Lane County data between 2000 and 2005.

Summary of Allegation Data – There were 4,121 allegations in 2005.

Just as the number of youth and their referrals have decreased over time, so has the number of allegations on those referrals.

2005 allegation data compared to 2000:

- Allegations decreased 27.3% (from 5,668 to 4,121).
- Allegations for person crimes decreased 26.2% (606 to 447)
- Allegations for property crimes decreased 29.1% (2,395 to 1,697)
- Allegations for other criminal offenses decreased 21.9% (982 to 767)

DETENTION

Description – The goal of the juvenile detention facility is to protect the community by providing a safe and secure environment for delinquent juveniles within which staff can facilitate changes in criminal behavior. Detention provides the following diverse services:

- Keeping a secure physical setting and preventing juveniles from escaping
- Preventing physical violence, intimidation, extortion or threats toward staff, juveniles, parents or any others
- Preparing juveniles for placement at treatment facilities
- Providing an education component, which ensures that no juvenile is deprived of an appropriate education opportunity due solely to his/her detention status
- Providing appropriate, timely and effective intervention strategies specifically designed to: a) recognize and encourage positive lawful behavior and change, b) modify inappropriate behavior/attitudinal manifestations, and c) induce and encourage general personal growth
- Providing meaningful activities and discussion group experiences
- Promoting family communication
- Engaging in a continuous search for innovative means of providing effective short-term institutional care

Summary of Lane County Detention Data – Data for Lane County’s juvenile secure confinement are based on length of stay.

There were 765 admissions in 2005. Of those:

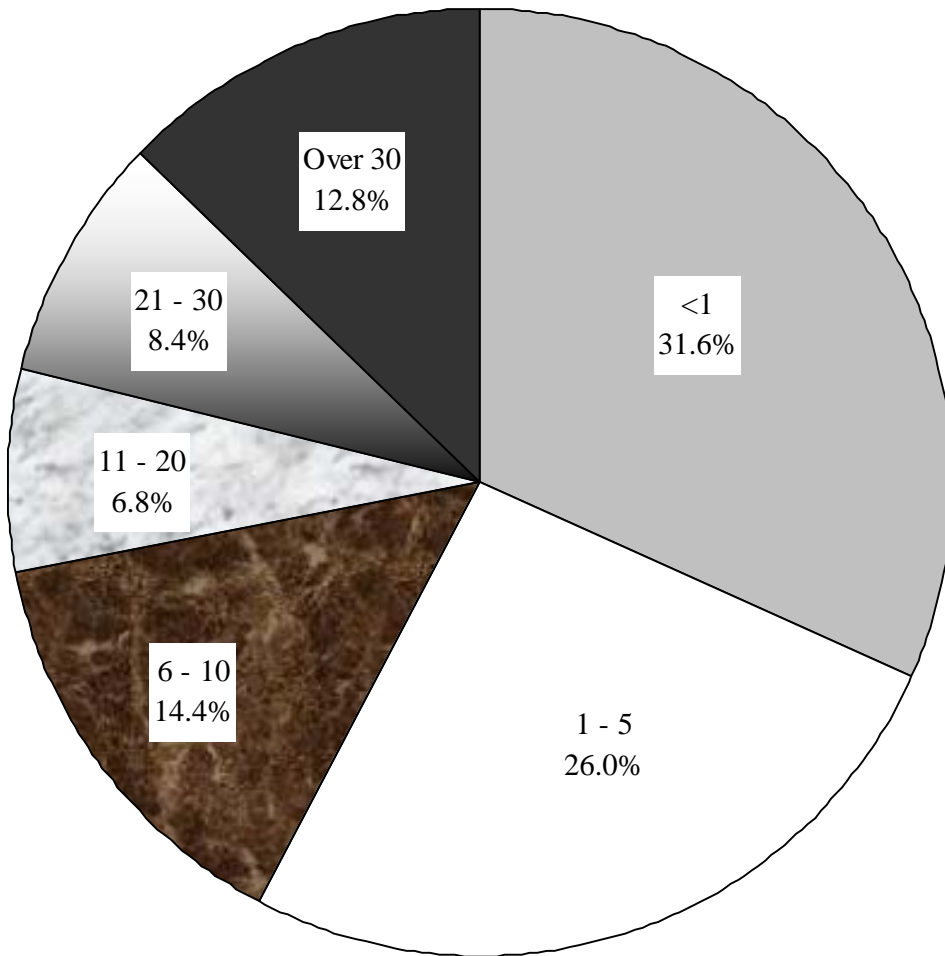

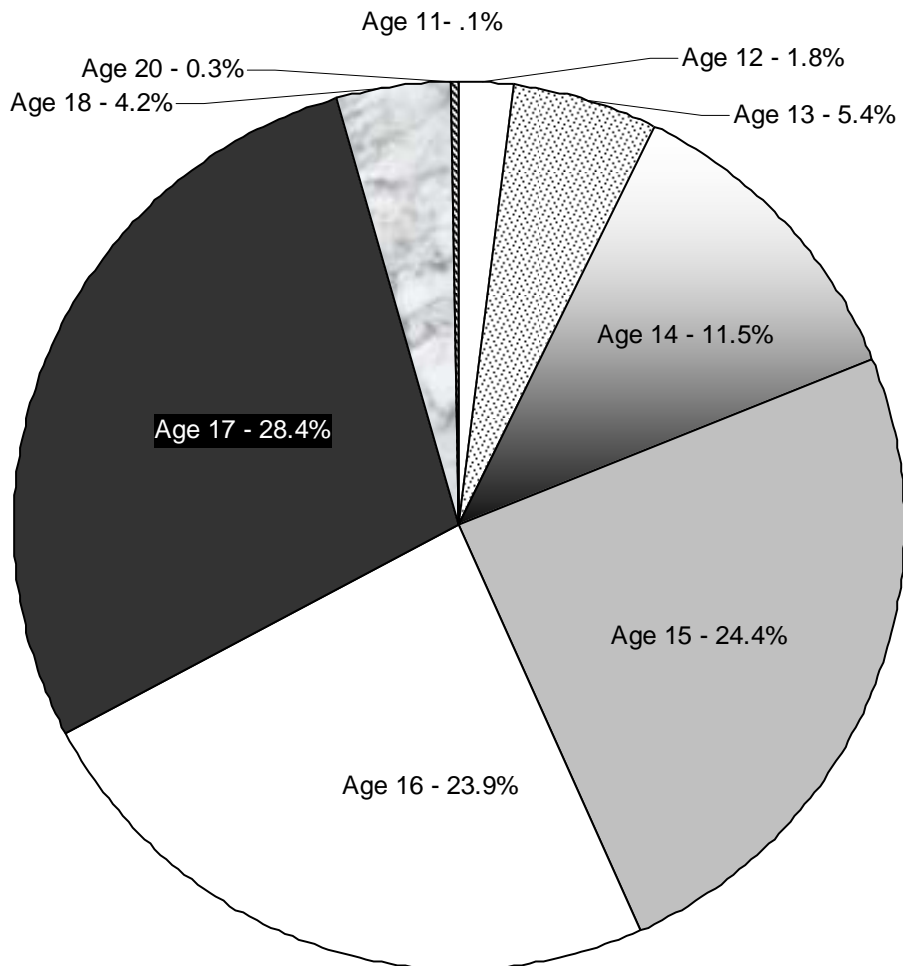

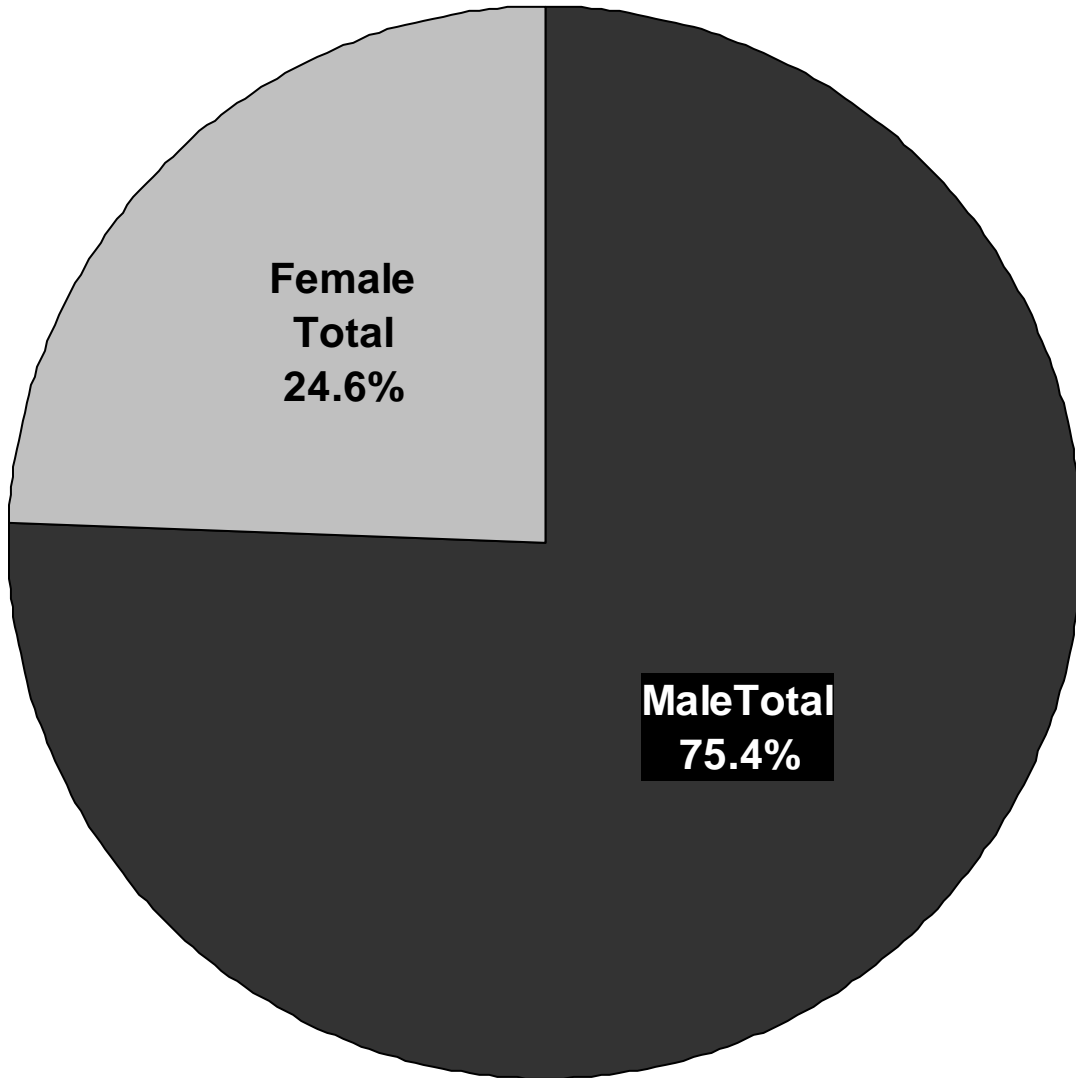
