# Primary Role of the Board

- **Convener** – Bringing together business, labor, education and economic development to focus on workforce issues and promote strategic alignment.
- **Workforce Analyst** – Developing, disseminating, and assisting with the analysis of current labor market and economic information and trends in industry sectors.
- **Broker** – Bringing together community stakeholders to solve common problems; align systems and strategies; and foster new relationships between business and education.
- **Community Voice** – Articulating the issues for the needs of a skilled workforce. Demonstrating and speaking to the effectiveness of training programs.
- **Capacity Builders/Investor** – Enhancing the region's ability to meet the workforce needs of local employers through the utilization of federal and state funds.

# Back To Work Lane County

- Received **\$100,000** From Lane County Video Lottery funds to fund **15** On-The-Job Training opportunities
- Matched by **15** state funded On-The-Job Training opportunities
- To date all **15** OJT's funded through the lottery grant have been placed in jobs making \$15.00 or more an hour. All **15** matching placements have been made as well.

# Back to Work Lane County Impact:

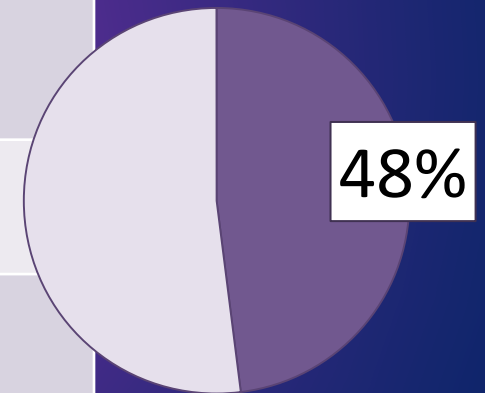
- *30 individuals* landed new jobs and received the opportunity to learn new skills while on the job.
