



- SAMHSA Grant End 06/30/21 1.0
 FTE Corrections Tech reduction
- Fully Staffed but carrying a 3% Vacancy Variance
- Used \$221,843 from Operational Contingency Account and unfunded two positions \$227,009 to balance budget



FY 21-22 In Review

COVID-19 Pandemic Impacts

- Revenue loss
 - CCA announced cuts & anticipated JRGP cuts
- Expenses that increased
 - New Building Rent, increase of \$150k
 - Fleet Increase 23k
 - TS increase 31k
 - Utilities in new building up 8k
- Workforce
 - Unfunded two positions due to anticipating reduced revenue



Future Challenges & Opportunities

- Cases reduced due to COVID impacts to the court.
- Commutations and prison releases have increased workload.
- Legislative proposal may remove supervision fees.
- SAMHSA Grant ending which will result in a 1 FTE reduction.
- There is currently legislation to fund misdemeanor domestic violence and select sex offenses for supervision. This could potentially increase revenue and fill a significant void in public safety.
- Lease space opportunity to assist with building operational costs.

 - April-2018-19 12.08% 595 Clients
