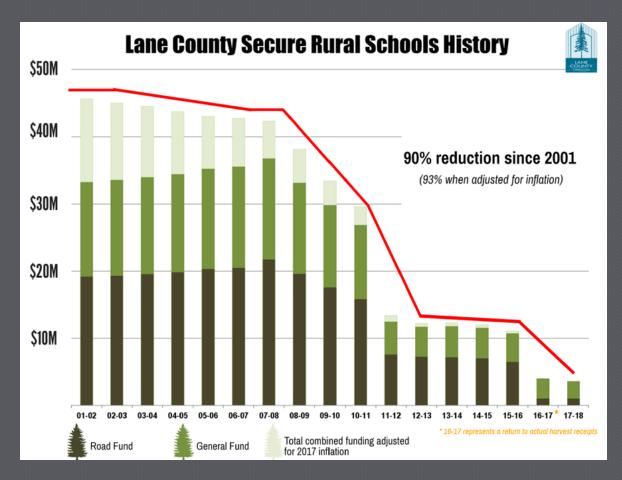

- ➤ Structurally balanced in the General Fund for the first time in 7 years. Structurally balanced budget in the Road Fund.
- > No layoffs or reduction in services
- > Reduced internal expenses and experiencing positive revenue growth.
- > Review & revision of reserve & budgeting policies.

- ➤ DA 2.0 FTE added mid-FY 16-17; Highest FTE in 11 years.
- ➤ HHS Maintain funding to Human Services Commission Phoenix Program Movement
- ➤ HR Hired Recruitment Specialist
- > PW 0.49 FTE Add LCAS / LMD Add 3.0 FTE; Rd Fd Add 2.0 FTE
- >TS 1.0 FTE added mid-FY 16-17 (HHS direct)
- >SO 6.0 FTE added mid-FY 16-17 (Levy); Continues to fund
 - 4.0 FTE w/i HHS & P&P (Mental Hlth & P&P officer)

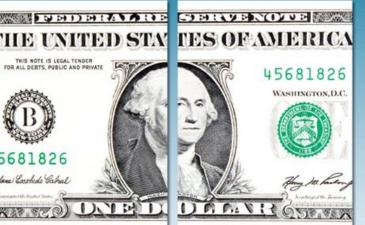
- > Less than adequate service levels
