To create and implement a wildfire mitigation/fuels reduction program for low-income and vulnerable homeowners in rural Lane County. Through this program, Lane County Firewise staff will conduct Home Ignition Zone (HIZ) assessments and hire licensed contractors to complete defensible space fuels reduction work on qualified properties. The proposal is to use the CWRR grant funds to make wildfire hazard mitigation assistance accessible for low income and other vulnerable homeowners by a providing subsidized fuels-management and defensible space work. Lane County is coordinating with outside agencies such as the Rural Fire Protection Districts, Oregon Dept. of Human Services, Lane County Health & Human Services, Oregon Dept. of Forestry, and Lane Council of Governments, Lane County Emergency Management, and more. Firewise Program will serve as the fiscal agent for the grant and will be responsible for managing the funds and reporting outcomes and expenditures to OSFM.
