In the Matter of Approving Two Public Works Contracts and Amendments and Delegating Authority to the County Administrator to Execute the Approved Contracts and Amendments for BRING Recycling, Expense in the amount of \$355,500.00; BRING Recycling, Expense in the amount of \$360,000.00.

Description	<p>The contractor will increase recycling and waste prevention activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – particularly organics and construction and demolition (C&D) debris – to reclaim valuable resources from the waste stream and elicit long-term behavior change in the commercial sector. The education and outreach program will have three primary objectives: reduce the disposal of materials with value, with a particular focus on organics and C&D; increase business recycling and waste prevention activities; and build a receptive market for commercial sector recovery by recognizing and highlighting businesses that improve their recycling/waste reduction performance. This work supports the County’s Solid Waste Management Plan and achieves compliance with state Opportunity to Recycle laws prescribed by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ).
