I. MOTION

MOVE APPROVAL OF THE ORDER ADOPTING THE FY2002-2003 SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET #2 MAKING, REDUCING AND TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS.

II. ISSUE

Under Oregon's local budget law, a supplemental budget is required to appropriate unanticipated revenues and expenses that could not have been foreseen at the time of budget preparation for the current year. A supplemental budget adjustment is also required where transfers create a new appropriation category or where there are reductions in appropriations.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

Submitted for the Board's consideration and approval is Supplemental Budget #2 for Fiscal Year 2002-2003. This supplemental budget was advertised in The Register-Guard on April 23, 2003.

We use the publication form of supplemental budget process available under state budget law. Separate rules apply to proposed changes above or below 10%. Because this supplemental contains changes greater than 10% for two funds (Special Revenue & Services Fund and the Title III Projects Fund), the Board of Commissioners is required to hold a public hearing before taking final action.

B. Analysis

Please refer to the analysis and description of proposed changes in Board Order Attachment A.

C. Alternatives/Options

Within local budget law, the Board of Commissioners may amend the supplemental budget as published, with any increases limited to \$5,000 or 10% per fund, whichever is greater.

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D. Recommendation

Budget staff recommends the Board adopt the supplemental budget and make the necessary appropriations, transfers and reductions as requested.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP

Upon approval of the supplemental, County Administration budget staff will adjust the appropriations on the general ledger.

When the FY02-03 budget was adopted, the Board approved a technical adjustment that reduced the employee benefit expense for all general fund departments and transferred those savings to the general fund reserve. The adjustment did not include departments which do not use discretionary general fund. When the adjustment was processed, the Land Management division of Public Works was included and \$9,396 of benefit expense was reduced. However, since the division is fee supported and does not use discretionary general fund, the amount of their adjustment is being reversed and the spending authority is being returned. A corresponding reduction in the general fund reserve is listed below under the General Expense category.

The Lane County Extension Service has requested \$17,000 be transferred out of the Extension Service contingency account and into their operations budget to be used for the 4-H program assistant and other related costs. Independent of that transaction is a transfer of \$35,000 from general fund reserves to pay interest expense associated with inter-fund borrowing authorized

by the Board August 14, 2002. Lastly, \$9,396 of general fund reserve is being transferred back to the Land Management division of Public Works as referenced in the narrative description above.

Two adjustments are being made to Fund 619. The net effect of both changes is a zero change to the overall appropriations for the Fund. However, because one of the adjustments involves moving operational contingency funds into the fiscal transactions budget of the fund, the adjustment is being called out for your approval as required by local budget law. The two adjustments are:

- 1) transfer \$35,000 from operational contingency to the fiscal transaction category in order to loan \$35,000 to the Parks Fund for the purchase of a new mower. (See description under Fund 216).
- 2) transfer \$30,000 from the capital equipment category to the fiscal transaction category in order to transfer \$30,000 back to the Animal Regulation Authority Fund as described in the Fund 283 narrative above.
