II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

On April 29, 2003, the Board of Commissioners directed the reformation of the Public Safety Coordinating Council. This has occurred by the adoption of the revised Lane Manual. It calls for appointment of up to 17 positions: Police Chief, selected by the police chiefs of Lane County; the Sheriff; the District Attorney; State Court Judge; Public Defender or Defense Attorney, appointed by the presiding Judge; the Community Corrections Manager, a County Commissioner; Youth Services Department Director; Health and Human Services Department Director; up to three citizens; a City Councilor or mayor from Eugene; a City Councilor or Mayor from Springfield, a City Manager or other city representative; representative of the Oregon State Policy (nonvoting); and finally, a Oregon Youth Authority representative (non-voting).

The positions that are identified by statute have all been filled pursuant to the direction of the April 29, 2003 order or by operation of law. As of the date of preparing this agenda item, the police chiefs had not yet made their selection. Likewise, the presiding judge had not heard back from the public defender on that appointment. However due to pending work items, it seemed a better practice to appoint the council now and begin functioning rather than await confirmation of all designees. Regarding the up-to-three lay positions, the office of County Administration conducted a recruitment during June 2003, a copy of the vacancy notice is attached. A total of six applications were received. The Board may appoint up to three members.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Analysis

This is a relatively routine appointment and no analysis is necessary.

B. Alternatives/Options

1. Appoint up to three members as directed on April 29, 2003.
2. Reject current applicants and re-post.
3. Modify appointment process in some manner to be determined by the Board of County Commissioners.

C. Recommendation

1. Follow through with the direction of April 29, 2003.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP

Once the reconstituted Public Safety Coordinating Council is appointed, County Administration will convene an initial meeting of that group.

PUBLIC SAFETY COORDINATING COUNCIL: (under ORS 423.560)

- (1) Develops and recommends to the Lane County Board of Commissioners a plan for use of
 - a) state resources to serve the local offender population and;
 - b) state and local resources to serve the needs of that part of the local offender population who are at least 15 years of age and less than 18 years of age, which must provide for coordination of community-wide services involving prevention, treatment, education, employment resources and intervention strategies;
- (2) Coordinates local juvenile justice policy among juvenile justice entities, and develops and recommends to Board the plan for use of state resources to serve the local youth offender population; coordinates local juvenile justice policy among affected juvenile justice entities;
- (3) In consultation with the Lane County Commission on Children and Families, develops and recommends a plan designed to prevent criminal involvement by youth, which provides for coordination of community-wide services involving treatment, education, employment and intervention strategies aimed at crime prevention.

MEETINGS: Quarterly.

VACANCIES: Three (3) citizen members.

MEMBERSHIP: Seventeen (17) members comprised of countywide elected officials and government agency, criminal justice, and citizen representatives.

TERM OF APPOINTMENT: 4 years (Staggered).






