TWO (2) NEW MEMBERS TO THE LANE COUNTY COMMISSION ON CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

I. PROPOSED MOTION

MOVE APPROVAL OF THE ORDER AND RESOLUTION IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTING TWO (2) NEW MEMBERS TO THE LANE COUNTY COMMISSION ON CHILDREN AND FAMILIES.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

The Lane County Board of Commissioners has the appointing authority for membership on advisory boards and commissions pursuant to the Lane Manual and to HB 2004, and therefore approves recommendations for appointment to the Lane County Commission on Children and Families.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background/Analysis

In 1993, the State Legislature adopted HB 2004 and directed the creation of local Commissions on Children and Families in all 36 counties throughout the state, charging the commissions with responsibility for system-wide strategic planning and implementation of a wellness model for children and families.

In January 1994, the Lane County Board of Commissioners appointed 15 members to the Lane County Commission on Children and Families (LCCCF). In accordance with HB 2004, terms were to be four years in length and staggered. In March 1997 and November 2001, LCCCF adopted by-laws (approved by the BCC) that created, respectively, two additional youth positions and one additional youth position. With the addition of these three positions the commission currently has 18 members. The by-laws define membership as two (2) County Commissioners, one from a rural and one from a metro district; three (3) youth representatives (between the ages of 15 and 20 at the time of appointment); two (2) rural representatives; and eleven (11) at large members.

Pursuant to HB 2004, a majority of members, plus the chair of local commissions, must be laypersons. LCCCF must have a minimum of nine (9) laypersons and up to eight (8) professional members.

In July 2001, four (4) adult and one (1) youth position on the LCCCF were publicly posted. Thirteen (13) applications were received prior to the August 3, 2001 deadline: ten (10) for the adult positions and three (3) for the youth position. The applications included four (4) from current LCCCF members seeking reappointment.

In November 2001, LCCCF requested and the BCC approved the appointment of two (2) youth positions, (1 existing and vacant and 1 newly created position through a revision of the LCCCF by-laws, BCC approved) and four (4) current LCCCF member reappointments.

On January 16, 2002 the LCCCF agreed to accept the resignations of commission members Skip Rodden and Douglas Perry. That resulted in two (2) vacant positions available for appointment.

On February 20, 2002, the LCCCF approved the membership committee's recommendation for appointment to the two vacant positions.

On March 20, 2002, LCCCF requested and the BCC approved the appointment of Joachim Schulz and Karen Hamilton to the vacant positions.

In April 2002 Susie Dey submitted a letter of resignation to the Commission, and later in June Susie Johnston also resigned. In addition Toby Hill-Meyer submitted his letter of resignation. That resulted in three (3) vacant positions, one being a youth position, for appointment.

On September 5, 2002 the Membership Committee posted the vacancies asking for interested parties to apply for membership closing on October 7, 2002. During the application process the committee received five (5) applications none of which were from youth. The committee decided to repost the youth vacancy during the period of October 10-24, 2002, and from that extension received two (2) youth applications.

On November 20, 2002 the Membership Committee recommended to the Commission the appointment of John Radich and Debra Depew to fill two (2) of the three (3) vacant positions on the Commission. The Commission voted on committee's recommendation unanimously, 9:0.

The recommended candidates are listed below, followed by the expired or resigned position they will be filling, and the new expiration date of their term. Attachment A: Recommended (New) Applicants for Appointments to LCCCF.

- Reject the Order and Resolution, do not appoint members to the Lane County Commission on Children and Families, and direct staff and the LCCCF on how to proceed.

C. Recommendation

Option 1: Adopt the Order and Resolution and to appoint two (2) new members to the Lane County Commission on Children and Families.

III. IMPLEMENTATION/TIMING

Upon approval of the Order and Resolution, new members will be informed of their appointment. A brief welcome/orientation meeting will be held in February 2003, and new members will attend their first Lane County Commission on Children and Families meeting on February 19, 2003. An intensive orientation and training for new members will be scheduled at that meeting and will be held shortly thereafter.
