LANE COUNTY, OREGON DEED RECORDS (18-12-35-32)

I. **MOTION:**

TO ADOPT AN ORDER TO DENY THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF MAPLE STREET, POSITIONED ALONG THE EAST BOUNDARY OF PRICHARD STATE WAYSIDE BETWEEN VIOLA AVENUE (COMMONLY KNOWN AS GLENADA ROAD) AND THE SIUSLAW RIVER AND BETWEEN BLOCK 8 AND BLOCK 9 IN THE PLAT OF GLENADA, AS PLATTED AND RECORDED IN VOLUME W, PAGE 261, LANE **COUNTY, OREGON DEED RECORDS (18-12-35-32)**

П. ISSUE:

To decide whether the vacation of a portion of Maple Street, being 60 feet wide and approximately 150 feet in length, and located between Block 8 and Block 9 in the plat of Glenada, as platted and recorded in Volume W, Page 261, Lane County, Oregon Deed Records, is in the public interest.

Ш. **DISCUSSION:**

Background

The Surveyor's Office of the Department of Public Works has received a valid petition signed by Michael Carrier, Director of the State of Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, and Arleta W. Ross, Trustee of the Ross Living Trust, requesting a vacation of a portion of Maple Street. The petitioners are requesting this vacation in order to extend the width of the two adjoining properties, the property on the west being known as Prichard State Wayside, and private property on the east.

Glenada was platted in 1889 and recorded in Volume W, Page 261, Lane County, Oregon Deed Records. The portion proposed to be vacated is the most northerly 150 feet, more or less, of Maple Street located between the Siuslaw River and Viola Avenue (commonly known as Glenada Road).

The petitioners allege that the described right of way has never been used or developed; however, upon a field examination on August 14, 2003 by Bill Robinson, Interim County Surveyor, he said that he saw evidence of public use. He stated that there were tire tracks of vehicles within the right of way of Maple Street and similarly worn footpaths from Maple Street out to the shoreline of the Siuslaw River. Bill Robinson spoke with a person who had just parked within the right of way, embarking on a clam-digging excursion, who said that he parked there often. He also noted that a small stream about 5 feet wide lies in the right of way, or near the east line of the right of way, that drains into the river.

The petition also states that Tax Lot 2300 (Lots 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Block 8, Glenada) was donated to the State of Oregon for the purpose of establishing it as a state park and providing public access to the river through the park. Bill Robinson noted that the park is currently undeveloped, and it appears that access to the river is gained by way of Maple Street rather than through the park. If the vacation were approved, the park would gain an additional 30-foot strip of land. But at the same time, the public would lose the easterly irreplaceable 30-foot width of public access to the public shoreline of the Siuslaw River, and possibly lose access to the stream that runs down to the river.

Qwest Communications, Central Lincoln People's Utility District, Northwest Natural Gas, various other agencies including Transportation Planning and Lane County Planning sections of the Lane County Department of Public Works, and neighboring landowners were notified by mail regarding the proposed vacation. The agencies and landowners either had no objections or did not respond to the referral.

The Board approved Resolution and Order Number 03-7-16-8 to set a public hearing on July 16, 2003 to hear and evaluate the merits of whether to vacate a portion of Maple Street, as petitioned for.

B. Analysis

Because the subject right of way provides legal access to the Siuslaw River, a public hearing is being held so that the general public can be notified and given an opportunity to comment on the proposed vacation.

If the petition to vacate the subject portion of Maple Street is approved, the west half of the right of way will revert to the state property and increase the area of Prichard State Wayside, and the east half will revert back to private ownership. The described portion of right of way is not currently constructed, but it appears that the public uses the right of way as access to the river. The petitioners have stated that the establishment of the state park was to provide public access to the river, however it appears that the public does not access the river through the park, but rather there is evidence of the public using the Maple Street right of way to park their vehicles and similarly a footpath from the right of way down to the river. There is a stream that drains into the river near the easterly right of way of Maple Street, and if the right of way is vacated, the public may lose the benefit of the stream also.

There are no known utilities within the right of way proposed to be vacated, and no landowner would be deprived of legal access to their property if the vacation were approved.

All required legal notices have been provided in accordance with ORS 368.346 and the Board is free to act at this time.

C. Alternatives/Options

The Board of County Commissioners has the options to:

- 1. Approve the vacation of a portion of Maple Street, as petitioned for.
- 2. Deny the vacation of a portion of Maple Street, as petitioned for.
- 3. Continue the matter for further consideration.

D. Recommendations

The Public Works Directors Final Report recommends that the Board support Option Number 2, denying the vacation of the portion of Maple Street, as it does not appear to be in the public's interest to vacate the right of way.

All statutory procedures necessary for the vacation of the above mentioned portion of Maple Street, have been complied with, including providing public notice and a report by the Director of Public Works who recommends that the petition to vacate the described portion of Maple Street be denied.

E. Timing

Timing is not critical in this matter.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP:

If the Board approves the Order to Deny the vacation of the described portion of Maple Street the Order will then be forwarded to the County Clerk to file the record in the Commissioner's Journal. The original document will be kept in the records administered by the County Surveyor of the Public Works Department. If the Board approves the vacation, an Order To Vacate will be provided for their final action at a later Board Agenda date.

WHEREAS, this matter now coming before the Board of County Commissioners for Lane County, Oregon, upon the Resolution, Notice of Hearing and Order No. 03-7-16-8 for the proposed vacation of a portion of Maple Street being located in the Northwest Quarter (NW ¼) of the Southwest Quarter (SW ¼) of Section 35, Township 18 South, Range 12 West of the Willamette Meridian; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has the authority to consider the petition to vacate this portion of Maple Street under the provisions of ORS 368; and

WHEREAS, Maple Street was platted as a 60-foot wide public road in 1898 on the plat of Glenada; and

WHEREAS, the portion of Maple Street proposed to be vacated is more particularly described as follows:

All that portion of the road right of way of Maple Street that extends from Viola Avenue (commonly known as Glenada Road) to the Siuslaw River, located between Block 8 and Block 9 of the plat of Glenada as platted and recorded in Volume W, Page 261, Lane County, Oregon Deed Records, all in Lane County, Oregon.

WHEREAS, the petitioners are requesting this vacation to extend the width of the State of Oregon's property, known as Prichard State Wayside, and the private property adjoining the subject right of way; and

WHEREAS, the petitioners have met the requirement of ORS 368.341(3)(f) as the petition has been signed by all of the adjoining landowners; and

WHEREAS, various public and private agencies have been notified of the proposed vacation; and

WHEREAS, the petitioners have paid a vacation fee of \$1500, and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has provided a written report, as required by ORS 368.346, attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof by this Order; and

WHEREAS, all necessary procedures for a vacation have been complied with, pursuant to ORS Chapter 368, including the giving of notice as evidenced by the Affidavit of Posting and Publication labeled as Exhibit "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof by this Order; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was conducted on this date, as ordered, regarding the proposed vacation of the road as described above; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of ORS 368.356, the Board is of the opinion that denying the vacation of the road, as described herein, is in the best interest of the public, at this time; now therefore, it is hereby

ORDERED, that the vacation of the above described portion of Maple Street is hereby denied; and it is further

ORDERED, that this Order be entered into the Lane County Board of Commissioners Journal of Administration and be further recorded in the Lane County Oregon Deed Records and in the records for administered by the Lane County Surveyor.

PURSUANT to the procedures set forth in ORS Chapter 368, we the undersigned State of Oregon, acting by and through its Parks and Recreation Department, and Arleta W. Ross as owners of the adjacent real property hereby petition for the vacation of a portion of Maple Street, which area to be vacated is described as follows:

"All that portion of the road right of way of Maple Street that extends from Glenada Road to the Siuslaw River located adjacent to Tax Lot 2300 and Tax Lots 1901 and 2200."

WHEREAS, the undersigned petitioners are owners of 100% of all the real property located adjacent to the above-described area to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, petitioners allege the purpose of this vacation request is to extend the width of the State of Oregon's property, known as Prichard State Wayside, by 30 feet and the private property by 30 feet. This right of way has never been used or developed. It protected public access to the Siuslaw River from Glenada Road when Tax Lot 2300 was private property. Tax Lot 2300 was donated to the State of Oregon for the purpose of establishing it as a state park and providing public access to the river through the park.

WHEREAS, no portion of the area to be vacated is located within the boundaries of an incorporated city or town; and

WHEREAS, the public interest will be served and not prejudiced by vacation of the above-described area; and

WHEREAS, petitioners, separately and collectively, have no objection to Lane County proceeding under the authority of ORS Chapter 368.326, for vacation without a hearing; and

THEREFORE, petitioners request an Order of the Board of Commissioners for Lane County as follows:

- 1. Setting a date for vacation of the above-described portion of road, with or without a hearing before the Board of Commissioners of Lane County, pursuant to ORS Chapter 368.
- 2. Upon review of the matter, to direct the vacation of the above-described road, and direct that title to be vacated area revert and vest in accordance with ORS 368.366.

The Surveyor's Office of the Department of Public Works has received a valid petition to vacate a portion of Maple Street. The Board of Commissioners, by Resolution, Notice of Public Hearing and Order No.03-7-16-8 has set September 10, 2003 at 1:30 to hear information, staff report and public comment to determine whether it is in the public interest, as required by ORS 368.346 to vacate the described portion of Maple Street.

Notification of these proceedings has been provided by posting, mail, and legal publication, in accordance with ORS 368.401 to 368.426.

The plat of Glenada was platted in 1889 and recorded in Volume W, Page 261 of the Lane County, Oregon Deed Records. The portion of Maple Street proposed to be vacated lies between Block 8 and Block 9 of Glenada, north of Viola Avenue (commonly known as Glenada Road) and south of the Siuslaw River.
