AGENDA ITEM: ORDER/IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTING JANICE L MACKEY TO THE LANE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STANDING COMMITTEE

I. MOTION

IT IS MOVED THAT THE ORDER BE ADOPTED IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTING JANICE L MACKEY TO THE LANE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STANDING COMMITTEE

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

Shall Lane County appoint Janice L. Mackey as the lay citizen member of the Economic Development Standing Committee to the Board of County Commissioners?

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background.

In November 2003 the Board of Commissioners amended Lane Manual 3.515 to include a fifth member of the Economic Development Standing Committee (EDSC), as shown in Attachment A. The Community and Economic Development Program published a notice in November 2003 requesting applications. EDSC reviewed these applications in January 2004 and determined that they wanted to seek more applicants who may offer a lay citizen perspective, as described in Attachment B. This notice was published between February 13 and March 15, 2004. One response was received. On April 1, 2004 the EDSC reviewed the application and unanimously recommended the Board of County Commissioners confirm this appointment to the lay citizen position on the Economic development Standing Committee.

B. Analysis

The process for receiving proposals was completed in accordance with usual notice process and selection procedure. The Economic Development Standing Committee review of the one application received from the notice resulted in a recommendation to fill the position.

The usual period of appointment to the position is two years. The Order is written to appoint Janice Mackey to the position ending January 31, 2006. The Board may want to consider coordinating appointment with other committee appointments that occur in January each year.

C. Alternatives/Options

The Board may:

- Approve the ORDER appointing Janice Mackey as the lay citizen on the EDSC, or
- 2) Decide not to make an appointment.

D. Recommendations

Number 1 is recommended by the EDSC, to appoint Janice Mackey to a two year term as the lay citizen on the EDSC, as provided for in Lane Manual.

E. Timing

Upon appointment the nominee will be advised of the EDSC schedule and becomeinvolved in the committee proceedings.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP

Upon appointment the nominee will be advised and involved in the committee proceedings.

3.515 Standing Committees.

- (1) Economic Development Committee.
- (a) Scope and Function. This committee provides recommendations to the Board regarding Lane County's economic development policies and activities, including:
- (i) Development and periodic review of Lane County's Economic Development Plan.
- (ii) Analysis of proposed uses of County real estate for economic development purposes.
- (iii) Review and analysis of economic development proposals or grants requiring Lane County sponsorship or participation.
- (iv) Review and analysis of requests from outside economic development agencies or programs.
 - (b) Membership.
- (i) Two Members of the Board of Commissioners, chosen as follows: One from the rural areas, i.e., the East or West Lane County District; and one from the urban areas, i.e., the Springfield, North Eugene or South Eugene District. At the Chair's prerogative, the Chair shall be one of the two members, and the other member shall be chosen from the other area.
 - (ii) One elected Department Director or designee.
 - (iii) One department manager.
- (iv) One lay citizen, who is not a vendor, as described in LM 3.506(2)(d), for a two year term, ending January 31.
 - (v) Non-voting staff support, as required.

MEMBERSHIP: Five (5): One (1) citizen, two (2) commissioners, and two (2) department heads.



Janice L. Mackey

1. Give a brief description of the experience or training that qualifies you for membership on this advisory committee (If you wish, you may attach a resume or other pertinent material.)

I am currently a business transaction attorney with a focus on small and emerging businesses, non-profit organizations and real estate. Prior to attending law school, I was the executive director of (1) an arts organization and (2) a rural emergency aid program. This background has provided me with an understanding of the needs of both businesses and non-profit organizations.

2. Why do you want to become a member of this committee, and what specific contributions do you hope to make?

I want to join the committee in order to learn more about economic development in Lane County and specifically, in the rural regions of the County. I live in Mohawk Valley and work in downtown Eugene, working with small businesses. I can provide a perspective from both a rural community, and as the needs of small and medium-sized businesses. I believe my background will also enable me to effectively participate in the review of funding proposals submitted to the committee.
