Agenda Title: ORDER / IN THE MATTER OF AWARDING A CONTRACT TO CENTER FOR FAMILY DEVELOPMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000 FOR A CO-OCCURRING SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL DISORDER TREATMENT PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 1, 2004 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2005.

I. MOTION

ORDER / In the Matter of Awarding a Contract to Center for Family Development in the Amount of \$100,000 for a Co-Occurring Substance Abuse and Mental Disorder Treatment Program for the Period September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

In order to enter into a contract with Center for Family Development to provide substance abuse and mental health services to persons having a co-occurring disorder, the contract must be awarded and the county administrator must be delegated to sign the contract.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

A Request for Proposal was advertised in the Register Guard on June 13, 15th, 19th and 20th, 2004, seeking contractors to develop an integrated co-occurring substance abuse and mental disorders treatment program. The amount of funding available for this new treatment program is \$100,000. Fifty thousand of these dollars were made available through LaneCare, the Lane County Managed Mental Health organization and fifty thousand dollars were made available from beer and wine tax funds.

Proposals were required to demonstrate evidence based practices, co-location of substance abuse and mental health treatment into a single treatment setting and integration of the alcohol and drug and mental health systems. Proposals were required to provide services to adolescents or adults and support the need for co-occurring treatment for the population presented.

Lane County received three proposals: Center for Family Development, Emergence, and Laurel Hill. Center for Family Development received the highest score with an average score of 297 points out of a total of 360 points available. Emergence's score was 277 and Laurel Hill's score was 285. No appeals to the process were received.

B. Analysis

The Center for Family Development proposed that adolescents from ages of 12 through 17 who have diagnosable mental health and substance abuse problems be the population to be served with these funds. Center for Family Development will initiate a pilot project to address the treatment needs of youth with co-occurring disorders whose parents also have co-occurring disorders. As indicated in the proposal, ... "there is a pattern of intergenerational substance abuse and co-occurring mental disorders among the adult 'in the families of youth with co-occurring disorders. This reality comprises one of the greatest obstacles to success for the youth in the treatment program and often results in the therapy reaching an impasse due to the therapist's inability to help the adult identify their problem and seek help for it."

The review committee for this Request for Proposal felt that adolescents with co-occurring disorders is an underserved population and the proposal for treating the adults in the family which have youth experiencing co-occurring disorders was an effective and evidence based model for successful treatment and recovery for adolescents.

The adolescent treatment will be funded through this grant. The adult family members will be billed through LIPA, commercial insurance and state funded treatment slots.

C. Alternatives / Options

1. To award a contract to Center for Family Development in the amount of \$100,000 for a co-occurring substance abuse and mental disorders treatment program and delegate the County Administrator to sign the contract. Awarding these funds would allow for treatment for youth ages 12 through 17 who have co-occurring disorders.
2. Not to award the contract to Center for Family Development. If this contract is not awarded, then the funds will not be spent on a new program to address the co-occurring disorders for adolescents ages 12 through 17.

D. Recommendation

To approve the motion stated above.

E. Timing

The effective date of the beginning of this contract is September 1, 2004.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION

Upon Board action, the Department of Health & Human Services will complete the contract and forward the contract to the county administrator for signature. The effective date of the contract will be September 1, 2004.

WHEREAS, Center for Family Development proposed serving adolescents from the ages 12 through 17 with co-occurring disorders.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Board of County Commissioners award a contract with Center for Family Development in the amount of \$100,000 for a co-occurring substance abuse and mental disorder treatment program for the period September 1, 2004 through August 31, 2005 and delegate the County Administrator to sign the contract.
