I. MOTION

I move Order # _____ to appoint John Clague to fill a lay position vacancy as provided by ORS 423.560 on the Public Safety Coordinating Council.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

A lay position vacancy exists on the Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) and needs to be filled under ORS 423.560.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

Under ORS 423.560, the Public Safety Coordinating Council develops and recommends to the Board a plan for use of 1) state resources to serve the local offender population, and 2) state and local resources to serve the needs of that part of the local offender population who are at least 15 years of age and less than 18 years of age, which plan must provide for coordination of community-wide services involving prevention, treatment, education, employment resources and intervention strategies; and coordinates local criminal justice policy among affected criminal justice entities.

In addition to the duties assigned to it under ORS 423.560, the Council develops and recommends to the Board the plan for use of state resources to serve the local youth offender

population; coordinates local juvenile justice policy among affected juvenile justice entities; and in consultation with the Commission on Children and Families, develops and recommends to the Board a plan designed to prevent criminal involvement by youth, which provides for coordination of community-wide services involving treatment, education, employment and intervention strategies aimed at crime prevention.

In addition to statute, PSCC is authorized under the 2005 Intergovernmental Agreement for Criminal Justice Services to ensure intergovernmental coordination, and ongoing systems analysis of our public safety system.

- (1) City Councilor or Mayor, selected by the City of Springfield;
- (1) City Manager or other City Representative, selected by the cities other than Eugene or Springfield;
- (1) County Administrator (non-voting);
- (1) Representative of the Oregon State Police (non-voting), selected by the Superintendent of Oregon State Police;
- (1) Oregon Youth Authority Representative (non-voting), selected by the Director of Oregon Youth Authority.

TERM: 4 Years, ending December 31 (*Revised by Order No. 01-5-9-1*)

B. Analysis

Applications received by the PSCC nominating committee resulted in a very robust discussion arriving at recommending John Clague to the council. Even though all applications appeared to

be qualified, the committee felt that the Mr. Clague would bring an informed and interesting perspective to the PSCC.

C. Alternatives/Options

The Board may choose to review the applicants and select an alternate.

D. Recommendations

To appoint John Clague to fill the lay position vacancy on the Public Safety Coordinating Council, completing the term designated through December 31, 2006 that was previously held by another lay citizen.

E. Timing

Effective: May 18, 2005 appointment to fill current vacancy immediately.

I was initially trained to teach students with challenging backgrounds. I was a graduate student at the University of Oregon in 1969, and received my Masters degree in the Education, with a 15 month fellowship that emphasized the teaching of disadvantaged students. I taught for 11 years in Roseburg, Coos Bay and Blue River, Oregon.

Additionally, I am certified as a school administrator. I worked as Principal of Westridge School in Oakridge, Assistant Principal at Madison and Cal Young Middle Schools, and Principal of Washington Elementary in 4j. During my tenure in Oakridge and at Madison and Cal Young I participated in the safer schools/officer in the schools programs.

- 1994, Chief's Advisory Forum for the Eugene Police Department, I served four years as co-chair with Tony Lum. Leonard Cooke was Chief of Police.
- 1997, attended and completed the Citizen's Police Academy for Eugene Police Department.
- 1997, appointed to the Eugene Police Commission, serving first as the Chief's representative (under Chiefs Hill and Buchanan) and later appointed by the Mayor to serve an additional term.

(On the Police Commission I participated directly in development of policies around Use of Force, Crowd Control and Incident Response, Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT), In-Car Recording and I am actively engaged in the debate around Citizen Oversight.)

For reference, I would cite retired Justice of the Peace Bob Peterson (Oakridge), Sheriff Jan Clements (retired), former Mayor Jim Torrey, Chief Bob Lehner and City Manager Dennis Taylor of Eugene.

2. Why do you want to become a member of this committee, and what specific contributions do you hope to make?

I believe that I can work with law enforcement and contribute my experience on a broader level than the Eugene Police Commission. My term on the Commission will expire in 2007. Now may be the best time to begin working with another group. I do have more time since my retirement from education in July of 2004. I believe that the

other factors that would contribute to my success on the council are my experience with juvenile offenders in the schools, my work with kids since 1969, experience living in the upper McKenzie valley at Goodpasture Road and Nimrod, experience living in Oakridge, and my experience and training with the Eugene Police Commission.

I want to be a part of making our community and county safer and better for families. I have enjoyed my relationship with the public safety community and feel that in a small way I am returning my gratitude for their professional service.

3. List the community concerns related to this committee that you would like to see addressed if you are appointed.

Law enforcement is suffering from a dearth of resources. Patrols are inadequate to call loads, jail space is limited, and the courts are jammed with a huge case load. We need to address the mandates of Measure 11. Jail space needs to be utilized to accommodate the challenges of Measure 11. It is the law, and was approved by referendum. That implies finding the resources for more staffing in patrol and jail, and providing enforcement support for outlying areas and municipalities. None of these needs truly speaks to issues of rehabilitation of offenders.

We are currently underutilizing the space at the Serbu Youth Center, and we could better use the facility to re-direct young offenders.

The District Attorney's office has lost staffing and reduced significant programs for victim support, and the prosecution of all offenses. Those losses have led to a triage-system of justice that under-serves the needs of Lane County's law abiding citizens.

Finally, I am an advocate for the work that our public safety employees perform. I would like to continue that advocacy at the county level.

3. Briefly describe your present or past involvement in relevant community groups.

In 1994, I was appointed to the Chief's Advisory Forum for the Eugene Police Department, and I served four years as co-chair. Leonard Cooke was Chief of Police. In 1997, I attended and completed the Citizen's Police Academy for Eugene Police Department. Beginning in 1997 I was appointed to the Eugene Police Commission, serving first as the Chief's representative and later being appointed by the Mayor to serve an additional term. My appointment expires in October of 2007.

From 1989 to 1999 I participated in a round-table of law enforcement and school officials that focused on youth crime prevention in Eugene. From 1994 to 1998, I convened that group. Captain Chuck Tilby, Eugene, was a member of the group.
