FUND DRAFT 2007 PROJECT PRIORITY LIST

I. MOTION It is moved that the Chair is authorized, on behalf of the BCC, to sign a letter of support for the 2007 Project Priority List of the Oregon Department of Human Services Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund for the Proposed Intended Use Plan.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

The Oregon Department of Human Services is requesting written comment from interested submitters and interested parties on or by August 14, 2006. The C&ED Program did not receive notice of this request until July 28, 2006. This post-dates the agenda item deadline for the August 2, 2006 BCC meeting. As written comments are due to the state before the next scheduled BCC meeting the C&ED Program recommends that the Board of County Commissioners send a letter of support approving the six Lane County applications listed in Attachment A.

The Oregon Department of Human Services is preparing to apply to the US Environmental Protection Agency for their SFY2007 grant under the Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund.

The Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund is a low interest loan program designed to finance drinking water system improvements needed to maintain compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. New projects are added annually to the List based upon points. To get on the Project Priority List, a water system must submit a Letter of Interest.

A project submitted on a *Letter of Interest* is put on the Project Priority List for 2 years. After 2 years, a project is removed from the List unless the water system resubmits an updated *Letter of Interest*.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

The State DHS routinely lists projects classified as priorities. Lane County has six projects listed in the Draft 2007 Project Priority List. In April of 2006 the BCC approved accepting a \$10,000 Technical Assistance Grant to establish the Row River Water District in response to the impending loss of water service from the City of Cottage Grove.

B. Policy Issues

The BCC has established the policy of supporting the Row River community in seeking solutions to their impending loss of water service from the City of Cottage Grove.

C. Board Goals

This action is in support of the Board's goal of maintaining a healthy environment with regard to water quality.

D. <u>Financial and/or Resource Considerations</u>

There are no financial implications or considerations in this matter. C&ED is only recommending that the BCC write a Letter of Interest.

E. Analysis

A Letter of Interest from the Board of County Commissioners will demonstrate Lane County's support of the six applicants listed in the Project Priority List. There are six applications within Lane County boundaries (see Attachment A).

F. Alternatives/Options

The Board can choose not to sign a Letter of Interest in support of adopting the State's Project Priority List.

V. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

Written comments must be received by the Oregon Department of Human Services on or by August 14, 2006.

VI. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

The C&ED Program recommends that Chair sign the attached Letter of Interest (see Attachment B).
