I. MOTION

MOVE TO APPROVE BOARD ORDER 06-05-17-xx ADOPTING CONTINUING TITLE III PROJECTS FOR FY 06-07.

II. <u>AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY</u>

The "Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000" requires that projects funded under Title III meet the criteria found under the six allowable uses. The Board needs to approve projects for funding for the FY 06-07 fiscal year.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

In an earlier Board Order, the proposed FY 06-07 P.L. 106-393 allocation was determined to be 49% to Title II and 51% to Title III. The Title III portion provides approximately \$4.85 million dollars in new revenue, combined with \$1.5 million dollars in carryover fund balance from the previous years. In total, the available Title III funds are \$6.35 million dollars. It should be noted that \$924,000 of the carryover fund balance is the benefit reserve of \$231,000 per year as previously approved by this Board.

On March 8, 2006, Lane County published a 45-day public notice in the Register Guard. This notice listed the projects for consideration by the Legislative Committee and invited public comment. The County received four project submissions from the public and one from the department of Public Works, Land Management Division.

The Legislative Committee reviewed the submitted Title III projects on May 04, 2006. It was decided to request additional information from the four public submissions and one internal project submitted prior to making a recommendation for approval. However, due

to the need to finalize the FY 06-07 budget, the Legislative Committee recommends that all continuing projects which are part of the County's service delivery be approved at this time. Additional Title III projects will be recommended at a later date.

B. Policy Issues

The County's budget process requires the Board to approve the Title III project allocation now so that the FY 06-07 projects supported by these funds can be part of the adopted budget.

C. Board Goals

Efficient use of the Title III funds received by Lane County through the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000, will assist in the renewal efforts of the Act which is Lane County's strategic objective D5: Develop timber revenue strategies, which states: "Lane County will prepare a plan that identifies strategies and actions to ensure continuation of County payments from the federal government under Public Law 106-393"

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

The fiscal impact on the Title III funds received by Lane County is detailed in Attachment B.

E. Analysis

Approval of the package as presented will fully fund the previously identified as ongoing/continuing programs budgeted for 06-07 at \$5,150,14 plus \$123,913 in associated program costs for FY 06-07.

FY 06-07 is the last year of the Act unless extended by Congress. The goal is to expend all monies available under the Act for Title III projects, while leaving a reserve sufficient to cover costs that may arise if the Act is not renewed and layoffs must occur. The estimated minimum reserve needed to cover those costs is approximately \$924,000.

F. Alternatives/Options

Option 1

Fund the following on-going/continuing projects:

- Search & Rescue \$294,306
- National Dunes Deputies \$57,449
- Forest Lands Emergency Services \$1,168,038
- Forest Work Camp \$3,189,647
- Juvenile Forest Work Team \$440,705

Option 2

Wait until such time as the outside Title III projects are reviewed and make approval decisions at that time.

Option 3

Fund a portion of the on-going/continuing programs.

V. **TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION**

The decision made in this Board Order will determine which Title III projects are funded for FY06-07.

A decision is needed to complete the FY 06-07 budget prior to Board adoption.

VI. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adopting option 1 as written in the Board Order.

VII. FOLLOW-UP

The Title III budget, as approved by the budget committee, will be adjusted prior to Board adoption by way of a technical adjustment to match with the projects approved by the Board today.
