BACKGROUND

Applicant: Cecil L. Robinson

Current Owners: Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson and Freedom Way LLC

Land Use Regulations in Effect at Date of Acquisition: Unzoned in 1974

Restrictive County land use regulation: Minimum parcel size of eighty acres and limitations on new dwellings in the F2 (Impacted Forest Land) zone (LC

16.211).

This claim was originally heard on May 22, 2007 and continued to June 20, 2007. The Board tentatively approved this claim at the June 20, 2007 public hearing based on testimony from the applicant and his agent regarding the single-member LLC and requested an order be brought forth as a consent calendar agenda item.

ANALYSIS

The current owners of tax lot #200 are Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson. The Robinson family, Cecil and Nancy, acquired an interest in tax lot #200 and #220 on November 29, 1974 (LSC # 7450682) when it was unzoned.

Tax lot #220 is currently owned by Freedom Way LLC, which is a single-member LLC created and controlled by Cecil L. Robinson on June 14, 2005 (WD # 043210). At the June 20, 2007 public hearing, the Board found that testimony and evidence establish the interest of Cecil L. Robinson continues and extends back to his original acquisition date of November 29, 1974, for both compensation and waiver.

CONCLUSION

It appears this is a valid claim for both tax lots if the Board continues to view Cecil L. Robinson as the owner of tax lot #220.

RECOMMENDATION

The County Administrator recommends the Board adopt the attached order.

WHEREAS, the voters of the State of Oregon passed Ballot Measure 37 on November 2, 2004, which added provisions to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) Chapter 197 to require, under certain circumstances, payment to landowner if a government land use regulation restricts the use of private real property and has the effect of reducing the property value; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lane County enacted Ordinance No. 18-04 on December 1, 2004, to establish a real property compensation claim application process in LC 2.700 through 2.770 for Ballot Measure 37 claims; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator has reviewed an application for a Measure 37 claim submitted by Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson, owners of real property located at 25510 Highway 36, Cheshire, and more specifically described in the records of the Lane County Assessor as map 16-05-19, tax lots #200 & #220, consisting of approximately 48 acres in Lane County, Oregon; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator has determined that the application appears to meet all of the criteria of LC 2.740(1)(a)-(d), appears to be eligible for just compensation and appears to require modification, removal or not applying the restrictive land use regulations in lieu of payment of just compensation and has referred the application to the Board for public hearing and confirmation that the application qualifies for further action under Measure 37 and LC 2.700 through 2.770; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator has determined under LC 2.740(4) that modification, removal or not applying the restrictive land use regulation is necessary to avoid owner entitlement to just compensation under Ballot Measure 37 and made that recommendation to the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the evidence and confirmed the application appears to qualify for compensation under Measure 37 but Lane County has not appropriated funds for compensation for Measure 37 claims and has no funds available for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, on May 22 and June 20, 2007, the Board conducted public hearings on the Measure 37 claim (PA06-7277) of Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson and has now determined that the restrictive F2 (Impacted Forest) zone dwelling and land division requirements of LC 16.211 were enforced and made applicable to prevent Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson from developing the property as might have been allowed at the time the Robinson family acquired an interest in the property on November 29, 1974, and that the public benefit from application of the current

F2 dwelling and division land use regulations to the applicant's property is outweighed by the public burden of paying just compensation; and

WHEREAS, Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson request either \$1,874,570 as compensation for the reduction in value of their property, or waiver of all land use regulations that would restrict the division of land into lots containing less than eighty acres and placement of a dwelling on each lot, uses that could have otherwise been allowed at the time the Robinson family acquired an interest in the property; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that under LC 2.760(3) the public interest would be better served by modifying, removing or not applying the challenged land use regulations of the F2 zone to the subject property in the manner and for the reasons stated in the report and recommendation of the County Administrator incorporated here by this reference except as explicitly revised here to reflect Board deliberation and action to allow Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson to make application for development of the subject property in a manner similar to what they could have been able to do under the regulations in effect when the Robinson family acquired an interest in the property; and

WHEREAS, this matter having been fully considered by the Lane County Board of Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the applicants Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson made a valid claim under Ballot Measure 37 by describing the use being sought, identifying the county land use regulations prohibiting that use, submitting evidence that those land use regulations have the effect of reducing the value of the property, showing evidence that they acquired an interest in the property before the restrictive county land use regulations were enacted or enforced and the Board hereby elects not to pay just compensation but in lieu of payment, the request of Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson and Freedom Way LLC shall be granted and the restrictive provisions of LC 16.211 that limit the development of dwellings and the division of land in the F2 (Impacted Forest) Zone shall not apply to Cecil L. and Nancy A. Robinson for tax lot 200 and Cecil L. Robinson acting as the sole managing member of Freedom Way LLC for tax lot 220, so they can make application for approval to develop the property located at 25510 Highway 36, Cheshire, and more specifically described in the records of the Lane County Assessor as map 16-05-19, tax lots #200 and #220, consisting of approximately 48 acres in Lane County, Oregon, in a manner consistent with the land use regulations in effect when Cecil and Nancy Robinson acquired an interest in tax lot #200 and when Cecil L. Robinson acquired an interest in tax lot #220 on November 29, 1974.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Cecil and Nancy Robinson still need to make application and receive approval of any division of the property or placement of a dwelling under the other land use regulations applicable to dividing the property or placing a dwelling that were not specifically identified or established by them as restricting the division of the property or placement of a dwelling, and it would be premature to not apply those regulations given the available evidence. To the extent necessary to effectuate the Board action to not apply the dwelling or division restrictions of the applicable zone described above, the claimants shall submit appropriate applications for review and approval of a new dwelling to show the specific development proposals and in the event additional county land use regulations result in a restriction of those uses that have the effect of reducing the fair market value of the property, the

County Administrator shall have the authority to determine those restrictive county land use regulations that will not apply to that development proposal to preclude entitlement to just compensation under Measure 37, and return to the Board for action, if necessary. All other Lane Code land use and development regulations shall remain applicable to the subject property until such time as they are shown to be restrictive and that those restrictions reduce the fair market value of the subject property.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that this action making certain Lane Code provisions inapplicable to use of the property by Cecil and Nancy Robinson does not constitute a waiver or modification of state land use regulations and does not authorize immediate division of the subject property or immediate construction of a dwelling. The requirements of state law may contain specific standards regulating development of the subject property and the applicants should contact the Department of Administrative Services (DAS - State Services Division, Risk Management - Measure 37 Unit, 1225 Ferry Street SE, U160, Salem, OR 97301-4292; Telephone: (503) 373-7475; website address: http://www.oregon.gov/DAS/Risk/M37.shtml) and have the State of Oregon evaluate a Measure 37 claim and provide evidence of final state action before seeking county land use approval.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the other county land use regulations and rules that still apply to the property require that land use, sanitation and building permits be approved by Lane County before any development can proceed. Notice of this decision shall be recorded in the county deed records. This order shall be effective and in effect as described in LC 2.770 and Ballot Measure 37 to the extent permitted by law. This order does not resolve several questions about the effect and application of Measure 37, including the question of whether the right of applicant to divide or build dwellings can be transferred to another owner. If the ruling of the Marion County Circuit Court in *MacPherson v. Dept. of Administrative Services*, (Marion County Circ. Ct. Case No. 00C15769, October 14, 2005) or any other court decision involving Ballot Measure 37 becomes final and that decision or any subsequent court decision has application to Lane County in a manner that affects the authority of this Board to grant relief under Ballot Measure 37 and LC 2.700 through 2.770 then the validity and effectiveness of this Order shall be governed by LC 2.770 and the ruling of the court.
