I. MOTION

NONE, this is a discussion item only.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

The Board of County Commissioners must adopt a FY 2007-2008 budget prior to June 30, 2007 (ORS 294). The Board is asked to give staff direction as to which items they want included in the final Adopted Budget Order and accompanying attachment.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

The County Administrator presented the Proposed FY 2007-2008 budget to the Lane County Budget Committee on April 26, 2007. The committee held a required public hearing, held three work sessions, took more public comment and deliberated for five hours before approving the budget and the taxing authority on May 30, 2007.

The notice and financial summary of the approved budget will be published on June 18th, 2007, in the <u>Register Guard</u> as required by state budget law for the June 27th, 2007, public hearing. The Board may make adjustments within the funds, but may not increase appropriations by more than \$5,000 or 10 percent of total fund expenditures, whichever is greater, in any fund. The Board may also determine, make and declare tax levies equal to or less than that approved by the Budget Committee.

B. Policy Issues

The Approved and Adopted budgets are in compliance with state budget law and do not conflict with any established County policy.

C. Board Goals

Lane County's budget and financial management policies support the County's strategic goal of ensuring stability in service delivery to promote the efficient use of public funds.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

The budget approved by the budget committee represents a balanced budget. In addition, any changes made by the Board of County Commissioners to the Approved Budget will be need to be offset in such a way as to maintain the balanced budget status.

E. Analysis

BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS (Attachment A) Totaling (\$457,030)

Lane County departments have requested a series of budget adjustments across multiple funds since the Budget Committee approved the budget. The proposed adjustments, summarized on Attachment A, are classified into several different groupings depending upon the level of review and analysis required, and whether or not they involve a policy issue. These groups include routine HOUSEKEEPING items, REBUDGETS, and GRANT RELATED items. New Adds, Reductions, or controversial items are called out separately below in the POLICY ISSUES section.

HOUSEKEEPING (no material provided except Attachment A)

These are technical adjustments that are the result of:

- Recent Board actions,
- Personnel reclassification/adjustments,
- Updated information or corrections of errors or omissions in the Approved Budget.

REBUDGETS (no material provided except Attachment A)

These are FY 2006-2007 expenditures or projects with dedicated funding that will not be completed by June 30th as originally planned. The remaining funding is therefore carried forward to complete the project or pay for the expense in the new fiscal year.

GRANT-RELATED (no material provided except Attachment A)

These adjustments are the result revised grant notifications or final funding awards. Grant adjustments modify revenue and expense equally. In that they are self funding there is no impact on the General Fund.

LIST OF CONTRACTS (Attachment B)

Lane Manual 21.145(1) (I) permits the County Administrator to execute contracts that are specifically listed as part of the annual budget adoption order. Attachment B constitutes the required list. Included is a single letter indicating whether the contract is a Revenue or Expense contract, whether it is an Amendment or is granting an agency authority to Bill, the name of each contractor, the nature of the contract, the contract amount, and the term.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS/DUES (Attachment C)

The list of Intergovernmental Agreements/Membership and Association Dues has traditionally been approved as a separate agenda item. Since this list has already been reviewed and approved by the budget committee, and since there are no further changes recommended, the list has been included as Attachment C for Board approval in a manner similar to the List of Contracts contained in Attachment B.

WORKSHEET OF BUDGET ADDITIONS APPROVED BY THE BUDGET COMMITTEE (Attachment D)

A summary of budget changes approved by the Budget Committee is under development and will be attached to the final agenda memorandum.

POLICY ISSUES

There are six non-General Fund add packages for Board review totaling \$2,522,204. Impact statements are attached as Attachment E.

Although not yet final, the Sheriff's Office will be bringing a General Fund reduction package to the work session as a result of the new US Marshall's Service contract falling through. Sheriff Burger will present the information.

Add Package - Solid Waste Disposal Fund

Public Works – Waste Management Fee Increase - \$2,076,200

A \$10.00 Tipping Fee increase was included in Budget #1. This adjustment increases the Tipping Fee from \$10.00 to \$16.50 per ton for Waste Collection and Cell Development and Closure; \$3.50 per ton is added for Nuisance site cleanup and Waste Diversion Opportunities pursuant to Finance and Audit Committee recommendation on May 24, 2007. Increase anticipated expenditures in Cell Development: \$500,000 and Closure: \$900,000; Nuisance site cleanup: \$436,002; Waste Diversion Opportunities: \$290,668; and finally adjust operational contingency: (\$50,470).

Add Packages - Special Revenue Fund

Sheriff's Office - Inmate Work Crew - \$340,743, 2.0 FTE Deputies

Revenue and expense is requested to be added to the Special Revenue Fund. As a result of eliminating the Inmate Road Crew from the Road Fund, 2.0 FTE Deputies are moved over to the Special Revenue fund and is reconstituted as the Inmate Work Crew. The new work crew will be self-supporting through contracts with local jurisdictions including Cities of Eugene and Springfield, EWEB and LCC.

Youth Services – Emergency Support Services – \$18,000

The department has begun to see revenue from their billing for Supervision Fees. They now anticipate receiving approximately \$18,000 in revenue from youth and families for supervision and formal accountability agreements in FY08. The department would like to use this revenue for emergency support services to youth and families who do not fall under any of their grant resources for services.

Youth Services - Lane ESD Funding - \$2,261

Youth Services will receive \$2,261 more in revenue from the Lane ESD counselor grant than was originally anticipated. These funds will provide intervention services to at-risk youth in rural schools.

Add Packages - Land Management Fund

Public Works, Land Management – 0.5 FTE Clerical Assistant - \$33,105 Although this full-time position was eliminated from the Road Fund, the Department is requesting that this position be reestablished in the Land Management Division funded at half-time by reducing the Operational Contingency. This is a position for a developmentally disabled person.

Public Works, Land Management - \$85,000, 2.0 FTE Planners

The department received a positive recommendation from the Finance & Audit Committee to increase the Long-Range Planning Surcharge Fee to offset half of the lost Video Lottery funding. Assuming the Board approves the fee increase; this Add Package seeks to appropriate the additional surcharge fee revenue and reduces the fund's reserves by \$85,000 to fully fund the restoration of the two long range planning positions previously supported by video lottery funding.

SUMMARY

All adjustments are self-funding, have offsetting reductions, or there is sufficient other revenue to cover the costs.

F. <u>Alternative/Options</u>

At the time of Adoption, the Board may choose to make adjustments to the budget. The only limitations are that:

- 1) Changes in any single fund cannot exceed \$5,000 or a 10 percent increase, whichever is greater, and
- 2) Tax levies may not be certified in an amount greater than what was approved by the Budget Committee.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board discuss the attached list of adjustments, contracts and intergovernmental dues/agreement. The Board should also discuss and provide direction on the policy issue items.

V. <u>TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION</u>

Final adoption must be completed prior to July 1, 2007, in order for the County to have the spending authority for the new fiscal year. Adoption is scheduled for June 27, 2007.

VI. FOLLOW-UP

Upon final adoption, staff will prepare the forms required by ORS 294 and distribute accordingly.

Description & Justification: Financial analysis completed in the spring of 2007 indicated that a fee increase of \$16.50 per ton is needed to provide stability in the Solid Waste Management Division (WMD) for three to four years. This increase would maintain operations and provide revenue to maintain the reserves necessary to meet DEQ's requirements for landfill closure and post closure reserves. Waste Management staff presented a fee increase request to Finance and Audit in May 2007.

Finance & Audit reviewed the request and financial analysis reports. The F&A committee was interested in developing revenue that will assist the County in cleaning up Nuisance sites and in developing an opportunity fund for Waste Diversion. Thus, the F&A committee recommended an additional fee of \$3.50 per ton for these two programs.

The fee increase of \$20.00 per ton is requested effective September 1, 2007.

Long Term Outlook: The fee increase will allow WMD to meet the costs associated with material and services, and to continue to fully contribute to the development, closure and post-closure reserve funds to comply with regulation and policy.

Service Impact: The addition of two new programs, Nuisance site cleanup and Waste Diversion Opportunities pursuant to Finance & Audit Committee recommendation will provide new services to the Lane County Community and may assist in increasing the Waste Diversion/recycling rates.

The increase to Cell Development and Closure will increase reserves necessary to maintain compliance with our closure post-closure financial assurance requirements with the DEQ.

Description & Justification:

With the deletion of the Inmate Road Crew program previously funded by the Lane County Road Fund, the Sheriff's Office is requesting to add the Inmate Work Crew program as a self-supporting alternative to incarceration for offenders. In lieu of jail time, offenders will perform certain maintenance work for city/agency projects. Contracts presently in the works with City of Eugene, City of Springfield, Eugene Water & Electric Board and Lane Community College are estimated to support 2.0 FTE deputies.

Long Term Outlook:

We will continue to acquire more contracts and increase the program throughout the fiscal year. Should the Secure Rural Schools Funding be eliminated, the Sheriff's Office would already have in place an Inmate Work Crew program which would be expanded to include additional contracts and the work now performed by our Community and Forest Crews.

Service Impact:

The primary focus of the Inmate Work Crew is on offenders that are ordered to serve short sentences of 20 days or less. The work crew is a dimension of custody which permits reduction in jail crowding, participation in an alternative custody/work program, an opportunity for the sentenced inmate to continue employment during non-custody days and retribution to the community.

Description & Justification: There is a Board Order Packet to be presented June 20, 2007 to increase the Long Range Planning Surcharge from 7.5% to 10%.
