I. BACKGROUND

The Board scheduled a seventh reading to begin deliberations on Delta's proposed amendment to the Metro Plan for May 1, 2007. The Eugene City Council took the following action on this proposed amendment on April 18, 2007:

Item C: Delta Sand and Gravel Metro Plan Amendment

Move/second: Ortiz/Pryor

Move to direct staff to prepare a resolution that finds that there is not sufficient evidence that a significant resource exists on the subject site consistent with the attached draft findings.

Friendly amendment: Direct staff to prepare an ordinance rather than resolution.

Move/second: Poling/Solomon

Substitute motion: Move to direct that the findings cannot be supported because on further review, there is sufficient evidence that there are significant resources on the site, and ask the City Manager to schedule work sessions for continued deliberations on the remaining issues.


Vote on substitute motion: Failed 3:5 (Bettman, Taylor, Ortiz, Zelenka, Pryor opposed)


