I. **MOTION**

In The Matter Of Recognizing The Eugene Human Rights Commission For Their Sponsorship Of "Choices In Mental Health Care As A Human Right."

ISSUE OR PROBLEM H.

Organizations throughout Oregon and the United States declare the month of May, as National Mental Health Month which provides an opportunity to raise awareness about mental health issues and recognize the contributions of local community organizations towards promoting mental health wellness.

DISCUSSION III.

Α. Background/Analysis

The Eugene Human Rights Commission sponsored a one-day conference "Choices in Mental Health Care as a Human Right" in the fall of 2006. The conference was designed to raise awareness within our community about the need to transform the mental health system, engage in a dialogue with consumers and survivors of mental health care about the stigma and discrimination attached to mental illness, and promote an interest in addressing the human rights for mental health care consumers. The conference was attended by 300 participants and was a resounding success in motivating the community to work towards a future free of stigma, where human rights and mental health care rights are guaranteed for people experiencing mental health issues.

B. Alternatives / Options

- 1. To recognize the Eugene Human Rights Commission for their sponsorship of "Choices in Mental Health Care as a Human Right."
- 2. Not to recognize the Eugene Human Rights Commission for their sponsorship of "Choices in Mental Health Care as a Human Right."
