I. MOTION:

Move Approval of Order 08- In the Matter of Awarding a contract for Lane County Charnelton Place Building EIFS Repair to Applied Restoration, Inc., in the amount of \$791,400.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY:

In order to ensure the structural integrity of the Charnelton Place Building, repairs to the building skin (EIFS) need to be accomplished this summer prior to next winter's rains.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION:

A. Board Action and Other History

Lane County purchased the property at 151 West Seventh, known as Charnelton Place, in April 2007 for relocating functions of Health & Human Services. During the due diligence process it was observed that there were problems with the exterior skin of the facility. These problems did not seem substantive enough to prevent purchasing the building.

After owning the building over the course of a year it became apparent that repairs needed to be made sooner rather than later. In essence, much of the application of the building skin during construction was less than up to standard and the previous owner did not perform routine maintenance.

C. Board Goals

Protecting the public's assets by maintaining, replacing, or upgrading the County's investments in systems and capital infrastructure, and identifying ways to improve space and facilities conditions to better serve citizens, insure the adequate maintenance of existing infrastructure, and provide an environment conducive to high employee productivity, as outlined in the Goals and Strategy B.1.d. of the County's Strategic Plan, will be served by the completion of these projects.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

During the programming for a new facility budget scenarios were prepared in order to determine the appropriateness of purchasing versus building a new structure. Charnelton Place was \$20 million below a comparable new facility. When the scope of the building exterior repairs was known, the Project Team re-evaluated the program budget priorities and removed some items in order to keep the overall budget in place.

E. Analysis

The building skin was evaluated by Western Architecture as a consultant to PIVOT Architecture, the project architect. Their report was forwarded to DRYVIT, the manufacturer of the building skin material. Based on recommendations, an RFP was prepared and put out for bid. Due to proprietary specifications, bids could only be accepted from certified DRYVIT installers. Five firms requested bid documents. The County received two bid proposals. The low bid was from Applied Restoration, Inc. (ARI) in the amount of \$791,400.

F. Alternatives/Options

1. Accept the bid to contract with Applied Restoration.
2. Reject the bid. This would mean the possibility of further interior damage to the building during heavy rain.

IV. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

If the Board accepts the recommendation, coordination with Chambers Construction, the project CM/GC, will be effected to erect scaffolding to begin a two phase project. The north and east side of the building will be repaired from June 1 through late June - early July. The second phase, the west and south sides, would be repaired from early July through October.

V. RECOMMENDATION

Accept the bid.

VI. FOLLOW-UP

Upon adoption by the B/CC, contracts will be prepared for signature by the County Administrator.
