In the Matter of proclaiming Tuesday April 28, 2009 as Earthquake Preparedness Day for Lane County to coincide with Governor Kulongoski and Oregon Emergency Management's State-wide Earthquake and Tsunami Preparedness and Mitigation Campaign taking place during the month of April.

### I. MOTION

TO PROCLAIM TUESDAY APRIL 28, 2009 AS EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS DAY FOR LANE COUNTY TO COINCIDE WITH GOVERNOR KULONGOSKI AND OREGON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT'S STATE-WIDE EARTHQUAKE AND TSUNAMI PREPAREDNESS AND MITIGATION CAMPAIGN TAKING PLACE DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL.

#### II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

Lane County Emergency Management has a proposal for informing all employees, to the extent practicable, about what to do during an earthquake, specifically to "drop, cover, and hold". The employees would be informed by Lane County's CERT team members as they go "door-to-door" to each work space between 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. handing out information and answering employee questions. This will coincide with the activities of the Cascadia Subduction Zone Earthquake exercise happening throughout the state during the week of April 27, 2009. Additionally, Lane County Emergency Management would also like to encourage other businesses, schools and the general public to conduct drop, cover and hold drills that week.

#### III. DISCUSSION

## A. <u>Background</u>

In December 2000, former Oregon Governor John Kitzhaber signed an Executive Order designating Oregon a "Showcase State for Natural Disaster Resistance and Resilience." This Executive Order supports an initiative of the insurance industry to reduce deaths, injuries, property damage, economic loss and human suffering caused by natural disasters.

The statewide campaign encourages Oregonians to:

• Conduct the earthquake drop, cover, and hold drill and, where appropriate, the tsunami evacuation drill. (State and local government agencies of any size and non governmental organizations with 250 or more full time employees are required by law

to conduct an earthquake drop, cover and hold drill [Oregon Administrative Rule 104-020-000-040])

- Collect emergency supplies
- Non-structurally retrofit homes and offices by securing objects such as bookcases, computers, and water heaters
- Structurally retrofit houses by bolting them to their foundations.
- Buy earthquake insurance

# B. Alternatives / Options

- 1. To approve the motion to proclaim April 28, 2009 as Earthquake Drill Day for Lane County.
- 2. Not to accept the motion.

## C. Recommendation

To approve number one above.

### IV. IMPLEMENTATION

Upon approval by the Board the proclamation will be processed for signature, then County Emergency Management staff will begin work on the necessary steps to implement the drill.

WHEREAS, the loss of life and property can be greatly reduced if appropriate preparedness measures are taken before damaging earthquakes and tsunamis occur; and

WHEREAS, Lane County Emergency Management will highlight these preparedness and mitigation measures and provide earthquake and tsunami safety information to citizens and Lane County Government employees; and

WHEREAS, April 28, 2009 has been designated as Earthquake Preparedness Day for Lane County to coincide with Governor Kulongoski and Oregon Emergency Management's Earthquake Preparedness campaign for the month of April;
