AGENDA ITEM TITLE: ORDER / In the Matter of Re-Appointing One Member (John Sullivan) to the Lane County Planning Commission

I. MOTION

MOVE TO RE-APPOINT JOHN SULLIVAN TO THE LANE COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

There is a need to appoint one at-large position to serve on the Lane County Planning Commission (LCPC) due to the 1st term expiration of John Sullivan.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

Lane Code and Lane Manual provide that the Planning Commission shall be established and that the Lane County Planning Commission shall consist of nine voting members to perform the duties and functions of the Planning Commission. Also, at least one member shall be from the coastal area of Lane County, and another must be a resident or own property on the coast. There is currently one position (at-large) on the Lane County Planning Commission that has expired.

B. Analysis

County Administration advertised the vacancies in September and October 2009. Applications were reviewed by the Lane County Planning Commission at their meeting on November 17, 2009. The Lane County Planning Commission unanimously recommends reappointment of John Sullivan to an at-large position for a 2nd term.

Lane Manual and the ORS require that no more than two members of the Planning Commission be engaged in the buying, selling, or developing of real estate for profit as individuals, or be members of any partnership or officers or employees of any corporation that is engaged principally in the buying, selling or developing of real estate for profit. Also, no more than two voting members of the Planning Commission shall be engaged in the same kind of occupation.

Lane Manual requires the Lane County Planning Commission to consist of nine voting members, each of whom shall be a resident of Lane County, and at least three of the voting members shall reside outside cities and at least two shall reside within cities.

The Board has decided that each Board member appoints a member of the Planning Commission from their district and the four remaining positions are at-large. The Lane County Planning Commission unanimously recommends re-appointment of John Sullivan to an at-large position for a 2nd term.

The present planning commission with the proposed appointment would meet the Lane Manual geographic and occupational requirements.

C. Alternatives/Options

- 1. Accept the recommendations to re-appoint John Sullivan to an at-large position for a 2nd term on the LCPC.
- 2. Appoint another applicant for this at-large position
- 3. Re-advertise and reopen the search for the vacancy
- 4. Do not re-appoint John Sullivan to the Lane County Planning Commission

Staff will follow-up on the Board's recommendation, immediately. Appointment and thank you letters are not included with this packet. The letters will follow pending the Board's decision.







1. Give a brief description of the experience or training that qualifies you for membership on this advisory committee.

I have lived all of my life (except for three years in Medford and four years of college in Salem) in Lane County and will always consider this my home. My family is fourth-generation Lane County residents in the Camp Creek Valley and I currently live near the family farm. Having lived here almost all of my life, I understand the uniqueness of this area and think I have a perspective that would be useful for the planning commission.

I graduated from Oakridge High School in 1991 and proceeded to attend Willamette University where I earned a degree in Business Economics in 1995. 

Supplemental Questions

1) In September 2009 I completed a Master's degree in Community & Regional Planning at the University of Oregon, and I finished my Bachelor's degree in Planning, Public Policy and Management at the UO in 2006. During my time as a student I had numerous opportunities to work on group and individual projects related to planning on both the local and regional level. My research interests have included work on transportation-related issues, climate change, food security, renewable energy policy development, and the broader issue of sustainable community development.

As an undergraduate I worked for 15 months as a student intern on Mayor Piercy's Sustainable Business Initiative. I conducted research for preliminary reports for individual roundtable discussions and the Task Force's Final Report to the Eugene City Council. In 2007 as a graduate student, I was a project team member and the graphic designer for the Eugene Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategic Plan. The national and Oregon chapter of the American Planning Association recognized this project with an award for top student project in 2009 for Contribution of Planning to a Contemporary Issue. In 2008 I was the energy monitoring design coordinator and case study graphic designer for the educational component for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for the University of Oregon in Portland's White Stag Block Renovation project. This project merged historic preservation with sustainable design principles and has helped stimulate further improvements in an historic neighborhood in Portland.

My graduate research project completed in September was an exploration of renewable energy feed-in tariff policy (FIT) design. This research compared Oregon's recently passed FIT pilot program with an alternative proposal in the 2009 Legislature, and estimated the impact of the proposals on electricity ratepayer utility bills and the associated benefits of increased deployment of solar photovoltaics in Eugene and across the state.

As a neighborhood resident, I served in 2009 as a community advisory member on the final stage of the Lower River Road Concept Plan. This comprehensive planning process addressed such issues as development of a neighborhood mixed-use center, how to meet the daily needs of neighborhood residents, and transportation corridor enhancements to improve safety, walkability and livability in the River Road area.

Each of these experiences has provided me with a unique perspective on the challenges and opportunities of applying planning principles to real-world issues.

2) Our communities face many challenges that include the recent economic downturn, the need to adapt to climate change, job creation, transportation, and energy use. I'd like to share the skills and knowledge that I've gained over the RECEIVED

as a planning student and a long-time Lane County resident to help our communities navigate our way through these challenging times.

- 3) The most pressing concerns that I see related to the Planning Commission are climate change, energy use, transportation, and family-wage job creation. We often try to address these as individual issues that require their own unique solutions. Yet no one challenge exists in a vacuum and a closer look reveals a system of interconnections between issues such that actions taken to address one often impact another in ways that may not have been anticipated earlier. A systemic approach to problem solving seeks to uncover these interconnected relationships and provide opportunities for change that addresses the issues as a whole rather than in isolation. If appointed, this is the perspective that I will bring to the Lane County Planning Commission.
- 4) Besides the student project teams mentioned above in #1, I was a member of the Environmental Planners and Policymakers, a student organization at the UO, and I continue my membership with the American Planning Association. My experience as a member of the Community Advisory Committee for the Lower River Road Concept Plan would also be relevant to my work as a Planning Commissioner.
- 5) Finding common ground between participants in any endeavor is a critical component of success and community planning is no different. It's important that we encourage a variety of voices to come to the table and actively listen to the conflicting concerns that may or often arise. This requires that we as decision-makers or community members respect each other's differences and continue to work toward the common good. I recognize that this no easy task, yet it is the only route to building a strong community that works for and is supported by its citizens. As a County Planning Commissioner, I would actively work to encourage those who may feel left out of the planning process to get involved, share their unique expertise, and together work to create the kind of communities we are proud to call home.
