Police Seek Information on Man Seen Near Murder Scene

Police are seeking information on a man in connection with the brutal slaying of Janet Mallicoat last Thursday.

The man was reportedly in the area of the Five Spot Drive In, 869 S. First St., between the hours of 5 and 9 a.m. on the day of the murder.

Witnesses say that he frightened a woman about 9 a.m. He apparently chased her up First Street until she eluded him by running into Grossman's Office Supply at 842 S. First St., across from the drive-in.

Police would like to have this woman contact them. About noon, a person fitting the man's description was seen in the area of the Studio Theater, 396 S. First St. He

was reportedly bleeding from an injury.

The man is described as 18 to 20 years old, with an olive complexion and slight build. He speaks only broken English and when requesting work repeats the word, "work."

He was last seen wearing baggy black trousers and a dirty white dress shirt, open in the front. He had a one day growth of beard and his shaggy black hair hung to his collar in the back and down to his eyebrows in the front.

Between the hours of 5 and 9 a.m. he is said to have entered the Five Spot Drive In four or five times.

At one point he explained in Spanish that he needed

work so that he could return to Mexico.

The man is wanted for questioning in connection with the murder of Miss Mallicoat at the office where she worked as a part-time receptionist, the Regal Map Co., 63 Keyes St.

The pretty, 21-year-old San Jose State College coed was repeatedly stabbed, then doused with a flammable liquid and set afire sometime between 10 and 11 a.m.
