## **MINUTES**

Wednesday, February 20, 2019

#### I. Introductions / Agenda Review

Chair Kent Fleming called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. The agenda was modified to move the CIP discussion ahead of Nominations and Appointments.

#### II. General Public Comment

None

#### III. LaneACT Presentation

Frannie Brindle provided an overview of the Lane Area Commission on Transportation (LaneACT), which is an advisory body chartered by the Oregon Transportation Commission that is staffed by ODOT. The LaneACT is one of 12 ACTs throughout the State of Oregon. The commission represents the geographic area of Lane County; Ms. Brindle noted that it is the only ACT in the state that consists of a single county, whereas other ACTs cover two or more counties. The ACTs are responsible for addressing all aspects of transportation (surface, marine, air, and transportation safety) with a primary focus on how the regional system will influence the broader state-wide system. The LaneACT consists of 29-31 voting members representing the various jurisdictions, modes, and interests throughout Lane County. Lane County has two voting positions: a representative of the Board of County Commissioners, which is currently Commissioner Buch; and a representative from the TrAC, which was prior TrAC member Jeff Paschall.

#### IV. Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

Sasha Vartanian provided an overview of the CIP and the TrAC's role in its development. The TrAC's role is evolving commensurate with the CIP which has been expanded in scope to account for additional transportation revenue from House Bill 2017 and to align with County priorities regarding safety, asset management, and the Transportation System Plan (TSP). The CIP development cycle is also changing from a two-year to a one-year cycle and being merged with a county-wide CIP for budget and work program planning purposes, which will increase the frequency of the TrAC's involvement.

Ms. Vartanian directed the TrAC to the TSP project list provided in the agenda packet as a resource to identify project funding priorities. Peggy Keppler clarified that the CIP funding assumptions and project costs would be developed by staff to enable the TrAC's focus on transportation priorities. The transportation needs for Lane County were identified in the TSP process, thus the TSP project list is the reference tool for new construction.

Becky Taylor clarified that the TSP projects were not prioritized based on need, as all projects are needed within the 20-year planning horizon; the "constrained" vs. "illustrative" project lists reflect funding assumptions regarding the projects that had a reasonable chance of being funded within the planning horizon. The funding assumptions for the TSP assumed competitive federal and state grants. Ms. Taylor clarified that maintenance was an on-going operational assumption, supported by the Road Fund, not within the TSP purview.

Ms. Keppler clarified that the CIP would consider both maintenance and new construction, with maintenance priorities being identified by Maintenance staff, based on pavement condition and other roadway health assessment tools. Ms. Keppler noted the opportunity to align maintenance investments with other priorities, such as adding safety countermeasures, and considering TSP project recommendations. Ms. Keppler said the TrAC's advisory role on transportation was needed to supplement staff's technical analysis in developing the CIP.

The TrAC requested additional information regarding emergency routes, safety, pavement condition, and the implementation status of the TSP projects. Staff committed to providing the requested information prior to the next meeting. The TrAC was asked to identify their top three priorities from the TSP project list for the next meeting to start the discussion for building the CIP.

#### V. Nominations / Appointments

**Chair:** Chair Fleming confirmed he was not interested in continuing as Chair and expressed interest in completing his term on the TrAC. Gwen Jaspers moved to nominate **Kevin Woodworth** which was seconded by Tom Poage; the motion passed unanimously.

**Vice-Chair**: Chair Woodworth moved to nominate **Gwen Jaspers** which was seconded by Kent Fleming; the motion passed unanimously.

**Lane ACT Representative**: Kent Fleming shared how historically the representative has been the TrAC Vice-Chair. **Vice-Chair Jaspers** agreed to serve on the LaneACT. Chair Woodworth moved to nominate Vice-Chair Jaspers which was seconded by Tom Poage; the motion passed unanimously.

#### VI. 2018 Report and 2019 Calendar

The TrAC had no changes to the materials.

#### VII. Info Share

Ms. Taylor provided a safety update regarding a campaign being developed in response to the pedestrian fatality on Hunsaker Lane. Lane County is working with the Safe Lane Coalition on pedestrian safety education for area residents and yard signs to alert drivers.

Ms. Vartanian shared that two applications were being advanced to the Board for appointment to fill the two vacancies on the TrAC, one being Mr. Saxon.

Chair Woodworth shared House Bill 2845 which would require headlights on in inclement weather and requested the TrAC recommend support by the Board of County Commissioners. Mr. Poage moved to inform the Board of the TrAC's desire to support HB 2845 which was seconded by Chair Woodworth and passed unanimously by the TrAC. Chair Woodworth also shared how the Every 15 Minutes program with Mohawk High and McKenzie Fire on January 8 – 9 was receiving an advocacy group of the year award in Salem in March.

Chair Woodworth adjourned the meeting at 7:30 p.m.


