CRITERIA

Lane Code 16.253 contains the Riparian Regulations. A Riparian Declaration is required prior to submittal of a Riparian Modification.

ORS 274.005(3) defines the ordinary high water line as “the line on the bank or shore to which the high water ordinarily rises annually in season.”

By submitting this application, you are requesting a representative from the Land Management Division visit your property and determine the location of the Ordinary High Water Line.

The riparian setback is measured from the Ordinary High Water Line.

The riparian setback for Resource Zones [as defined in LC 16.253(2)(b)] is 100 feet. For all other zones, the riparian setback is 50 feet.
